

OCEANIC SHATTERED

Lusitania Lands Passengers at Pier on Fourth Day Out From Queenstown.

New York, Sept. 2.—Three new ocean records fell to the Cunard liner Lusitania, on her latest trip from Queenstown, which ended tonight. The Lusitania made the passage in four days 11 hours and 42 minutes, thereby clipping three hours and four minutes from her fastest time maintained an average speed of 25.35 knots for the entire voyage, beating the Mauretania's record of 25.84, and finally, by landing her passengers at the Cunard pier shortly before 6 o'clock, she became the first liner to dock on the fourth day out from Queenstown.

The Lusitania left Daunt's Rock last Sunday morning at 10 o'clock. Her days' runs follow: Sunday, 8 1/2; Monday, 6 5/8; Tuesday, 6 1/2; Wednesday, 6 1/2; Thursday, 6 1/2; and from noon today, 12; 2, 6 1/2, 2 7/8.

The Lusitania and Mauretania lightships have left Queenstown on Sunday and reached the Ambrose channel lightship too late on Thursday evening to allow them to dock before Friday morning. Today, for the first time, one of them proved herself a Thursday ship in the vernacular, as she came on board, and thereby became a real four-day boat.

The apparent rapid movement of the "meteor" was an illusion due to fast moving clouds, according to Dr. Pack.
