HELD IN CHECK BY MONEY MARKET

Speculation in Wall Street at Present Is Slow and Uncertain.

PROFIT-TAKING THE RULE GREAT INTEREST IN BRITISH POLITICAL SITUATION.

New York, Oct. 30.—The speculative tone showed unsheltered during the short session of the stock exchange today. The close of the week brought some natural inclination to close up contracts and take profits. This was emphasized by doubts of what the bank statement, which was published after the market closed, would show. There were new questions raised regarding the foreign money position and its probable bearing on the markets for stocks. The determination manifest by the Bank of England to maintain its control of the London money market revived a discussion of the response likely to be made by other markets and the probability of a further advance in the official discount rate of the Imperial Bank of Germany was revived. The part played by the political outlook in shaping the policy of the Bank of England is receiving increasing consideration in view of the opinion expressed in London that a general election in January is likely. The result of the Bernadotte by-election this week shall confirm the house of lords in the determination to reject the budget framed by the liberal government of England, there will be financial consequences to consider which will call for attention in other financial centers as well as in London. As pointed out by the London Statist, the rejection of the budget would involve the government in carrying on the government. Chicago, Oct. 30.—Bearish foreign advices inspired considerable wheat selling today, causing moderate weakness, with declines of 1/2 cent in all deliveries of wheat. The market was subjected to selling pressure all day. Following declines ranging from 1/2 cent to 1 cent, the market moved within narrow limits, December selling between 105 and 105 1/2. The market closed weak at almost the same level. Clear weather throughout the corn belt, officially predicted to continue over Sunday, prompted selling in all deliveries, resulting in moderate declines in all deliveries. The close was at almost the lowest, with prices 1/4 to 1/2 below yesterday's.
