

COURT INSTRUCTS FOR DEFENDANTS

No Damages for Deaths of Two Men, Nor for Personal Injury.

Verdicts for defendant were returned in three cases in the United States court, Monday, in two damage cases brought against the Boston Consolidated Mining company for the deaths of Seth Taft and Clint B. Leigh, in 1907. The cases had been tried over a week. The verdicts were results of instructions by the court.

DEATH ADJOURNS JURY Federal Tribunal Takes Recess to Enable Member to Attend Funeral of Wife.

As a result of the death of Provo Sunday of Mrs. K. S. Perry of Mantu, wife of one of the men now serving on the grand jury in the United States court here, the deliberations of the grand jury have been interrupted for two or three days, the jury lacking one of having a quorum of sixteen members by reason of the absence of Mr. Perry.

A compromise having been effected, the suit of Marcus Roubesh against the Rio Grande Western Railway company was dismissed by Judge George G. Armstrong of the district court yesterday on the filing of stipulation.
