

### BOOSTERS' JOURNEY TO BE MEMORABLE

All-Utah Excursion Will Mark Epoch in Development of State.

PROMINENT MEN ARE GOING RUSH FOR RESERVATIONS SWAMPS SECRETARY CAINE.

"All aboard for Utah!" will be the cry Monday morning when the big special train of the Commercial club's All-Utah excursion starts for the week's trip through the principal cities of the state. It's going to be the biggest excursion ever sent out by the Commercial club, and promises to be one of the most entertaining ever conducted.

The amount of enthusiasm which has been created throughout the state where the excursionists will stop is tremendous. Commercial clubs of Logan, Ogden, Provo, Tooele and other places where the train will stop have arranged entertainments varying in kind, according to the time of the stop.

In short, there will be something doing every minute of the time, from the moment the special leaves the depot of the Salt Lake Route on Monday morning until it reaches Salt Lake again Saturday on the return trip.

Members of the board of governors will also go along on the trip, its resources and commercial standing in the state. The booklet is profusely illustrated with halftones showing the smelting industry, mining industry and factories along the railroad lines and in the cities.

### Incorporations

A copy of the articles of incorporation of the Murdock Candy company at Logan was filed with the secretary of state yesterday. The company is capitalized at \$50,000, divided into shares of \$10 each. Robert Murdock is president; W. Jones, vice president; O. G. Carlson, secretary; Robert Murdock, Jr., treasurer. Johanna Murdock, M. N. Neuberger and G. W. Yeshman are additional directors. The company takes over the business of Robert Murdock & Son of Logan.


