## Sanitary Drain and Sewer.

### The big Sanitary Drain and Sewer for Garland is a go at last.

The Utah Idaho Sugar Co. will begin the work right away of putting in a sanitary drain and sewer on Austin street.

The drain will extend from the barrow pond near the O. S. L. depot to the Company's silo at the Sugar Factory.

At the Garland office of the Utah-Idaho Sugar Co. Tuesday, bids from a number of contractors were opened and Davis & Heuser of Salt Lake City were the lowest bidders.

The awarding of the contract will be made through the Company's head office at Salt Lake and in all probability the bid of Davis & Heuser will be accepted.

Austin street is an ideal location for the drain as the southern portion of town which slopes to the south, can be drained to the north and the land north of the drain has a natural southern slope.

The drain and sewer will be worth thousands of dollars to our town and the Sugar Company deserves great credit in promoting a worthy move of this kind. Garland is forging to the front.

## Town Board.

Tuesday evening, June 8th, the Town Board met at the Town hall in regular session, full board present.

A petition was presented by a committee requesting Town Board to raise liquor license to \$1,000 a year and to fix the hours of opening and closing from 7 a. m. to 7 p. m. The Board recommended that petition be returned to committee for further circulation.

The Clerk was authorized to have sanitary notices printed and posted. A number of bills were allowed.

## Apple Growers Attention.

It is time to spray your apple trees for the codling moth. Don't fail to spray even if the trees appear to have only a few apples on, as the fruit will likely be a good price, and if it is wormy the new law makes it a misdemeanor to offer it for sale. Spray sure, and do it now.

Formula:—One lb. Paris green or six lbs. Arsenate of Lead to one hundred and twenty gallons of water. Keep it well stirred and put it on with a good force. Use a Bordeaux nozzle.

## It's up to Voters.

Next Tuesday a special election will be held at the Garland hall from 7 a. m. to 7 p. m. for the qualified voters of the Sunset precinct, the purpose of which is: "Shall the tax rate in the state of Utah be increased 1 mill for a period of fifteen years to build a state capitol at Salt Lake City?"

Ogden is opposed to the taxes and pledges to put up one-half million dollars to build said capitol in the capital of Weber County and thus cut out the tax.

Of course our taxes are already too high, but voters should carefully consider following: Do you want higher taxes? Is Ogden a proper place for the state capitol? Is 1 mill for 15 years going to break you? Will Ogden put up the \$500,000? How much will Salt Lake give to secure the capitol? Think it over.
