

SCIENCE and INVENTION

Gasoline Atlantic Cruiser.
A gasoline Atlantic cruiser is coming into existence in London. It is 55 feet long and with 240 horse power develops a speed of 20 miles per hour. There are three screws, of which the two outer are actuated by gas engines of 100 horse power each and drive the boat at the maximum speed. The central screw is operated by an engine of 40 horse power and is used chiefly for cruising at low speeds, though it may also be used as an auxiliary in the event of an emergency. This central screw also is used in maneuvering the boat. Accommodations are provided for six passengers and a crew of two men. One provision of the cruiser requires that the boat shall cross the Atlantic under its own power, which it is expected will be accomplished in about seven days. Fuel accommodation is provided for a radius of ten days at full speed, or a distance of 4,000 miles.

Separable Hinge.
It is customary to have the door or window shutters in the spring and put them up again in the fall, but the work is very trying to the workman, and it is hardly a job of sufficient importance to warrant calling a carpenter. A New Yorker has invented an improved type of hinge adapted to overcome this difficulty. The construction also provides a means to the pin for the application of a lubricant. The pin is formed integral with the leaves which are attached to the door jamb, while the other leaves of the hinges are formed with slotted knuckles adapted to fit into recesses in



the pin knuckles and engage the pin. The slots in the knuckles of the door leaves, however, are oppositely disposed, so that when mounting the door the upper leaf is first moved into engagement with its corresponding pin leaf and then the lower one is moved into position. The door is kept thus in latched position by the action of gravity, but can be unlatched by a horizontal pull. The upper leaves cannot be disconnected until the door is wide open.

Modern Canal Making.
How a canal is made is illustrated in the excavation near Seattle of a canal two miles long, 33 feet deep at low water, and 60 feet wide at the bottom, which is to connect the water with a fresh water lake near Seattle. The work is being done by hydraulic monitors, the supply for which comes from a reservoir. The available head is 200 feet and the quantity used is between 8,000,000 and 12,000,000 gallons per twenty-four hours. The cut consists in part of wooden stave pipe, 18 inches and 30 inches in diameter. With a ditch made an average daily excavation of 2,000 cubic yards is attained. The material is a glacial deposit, containing sand, gravel, boulders and several varieties of clay, some of which have required shaping up to light blasting before the water would penetrate them. The excavated material is being used to reclaim a tract of land now submerged at high tide, being conveyed to the site in part by a flume carried on trestles. This flume is lined with wooden blocks 10 inches to 12 inches thick, set on end and laid closed jointed. A gradient of 1 to 28 is found to suffice, checking being liable to occur with more steep slopes. Where the flume ends a pipe line has been employed, the post-hole at the upper end of which is lined with wood in the same way as the flume in order to take the wear. The length of this pipe line is 2,200 feet.

Metal Discovered by Accident.
The discovery of glass was an accident, and so was the discovery of the new metal, radium argenteum—an interesting accident. The inventors, two Tuscan engineers, Turanin and Fabiani, had spent nearly \$20,000 in futile experiments, when Turanin, annoyed with their inability to find his metals after hours of boiling, fortuitously chanced to toss a two franc piece into the crucible. The coin supplied the needed ingredients for fusion and the problem was solved. The new metal is composed of copper, iron and fine portions of silver, radium and phosphorus. It has been patented.

To Plate Aluminum.
A method of plating aluminum with gold and silver has been devised. The troublesome oxide is removed from the surface, and the superficial coating of zinc or copper applied by plating can be plated with silver.
