NEWS SUMMARY

The supreme court of Illinois has declared that the new local option law passed last year is constitutional. The forty-sixth annual convention of the National Educational association will be held in Cleveland, Ohio, June 29.

The churches of Burlington, N. J., have proposed a bar on the "Merry Widow" hats in the congregation during the service.

By the discovery of two more bodies last week, the number of lives lost in the fire at Chelsea, Mass., is brought up to fifteen.

The Russian government has ordered five new warships, each one to be larger than the Dreadnaught, from a firm of Clyde ship-builders.

A federal grand jury is about to begin an investigation of several of the largest manufacturers of manila wrapping paper in the state of New York.

A serious fire which for a time threatened to wipe out all the property at Cape May Point, N. J., destroyed a dozen buildings before it was gotten under control.

William N. Cleveland, nephew of ex-President Grover Cleveland, has been sentenced, as a bridge trust agent, to pay a fine of \$500 and serve five days in the Toledo, Ohio, jail.

Ex-President Cleveland is ill at Lakewood, N. J., but the latest bulletins issued would indicate that there is no cause for alarm, and that his recovery is only a matter of time.

Count Szechenyi and the countess, formerly Gladys Vanderbilt, had a narrow escape from drowning at Vienna, when their boat capsized, they being forced to swim to the shore.

Two prominent business men of Milan, Mich., were instantly killed when their automobile was struck by a passenger train while they were attempting to cross the track near Dearborn.

Frank Schneck, on trial at Ottawa, Kans., for the murder of his wife and two children, at their home at Centropolis on February 3, 1907, was found guilty of murder in the first degree by the jury.

The town of Cairo, Ill., at the election last week, decided against closing the saloons. At Thebes, where the prohibitionists were victorious, there are six saloons which will be compelled to close their doors.

David Wetherbee, aged 75, his wife, aged 65, and their daughter were cremated, and Albert Lemm, the daughter's husband, was probably fatally burned in a fire that destroyed the Wetherbee home at Centerville, Pa.

It has been definitely decided that the American fleet of battleships will not call at any European port on its way home, with the exception of certain points in the Mediterranean where it will be necessary to stop for coal.

Harry Thaw is to have a chance to prove his sanity, and will be taken into court in the near future and examined by experts. If the court decides that he is sane, the chances of his release in the near future are very bright.

A dispatch from Winnipeg announces that while on their way to the Peach river country, Emil Cardinal, wife and child, were drowned in the Athabasca river. They were traveling on the ice with a dog team and fell through.

A baseball tossed by a boy struck Mrs. Catherine Murray of New York over the heart, death resulting a few hours later. An autopsy disclosed the fact that Mrs. Murray's heart had swollen to an abnormal size as a result of the blow.

The Northern Pacific Railway company has posted a bulletin offering a reward of \$500 for the arrest and conviction of the bandits who attempted to hold up the North Coast Limited near Homestead, fifteen miles east of Butte.

Bernard, the 2-year-old son of Bailey B. Nagal, president of the Pennsylvania boiler works, and grandson of T. M. Nagal, a multi-millionaire, died at Erie, Pa., on April 24, as the result of taking medicine prescribed for his mother, believing it to be candy.

Four men were killed, three seriously injured and 100 others had a narrow escape from death when an explosion occurred in Mine No. 1 of the Ellsworth Colliers company at Ellsworth, Pa. The dead are foreigners. Their bodies were mangled and badly burned.

Flores Omtaneda, a noted Ecuadorian chemist, is dead a Guayaquil, Ecuador, from bubonic plague, which he contracted at the municipal laboratory while preparing Haffkine's prophylactic. Twenty new cases and nine deaths have occurred at Guayaquil in the past week.

Experts of the water pollution committee of the New York Merchants' association declare that 7,650 deaths annually from typhoid fever and kindred diseases are directly attributable to the common house fly, and war upon the house fly is to be waged by the association.

Louis Abrahams, president of the diamond syndicate which controls 98 per cent of the diamond output of the world, says that there is to be no shrinkage in the price of diamonds, despite the fact that there is now a marked decrease in the demand for the precious stones.

Ford Warner, a member of the house of delegates of St. Louis, has been convicted of bribery and sentenced to two years' imprisonment. Warner was convicted of having accepted a bribe of \$500 to influence legislation permitting the erection of a garage by a citizen.




