DAILY DIET HINTS By D.P. T. J. ALLEN

AUTO-NUTILITION.

Auto-nutrition, feeding upon one's own body, Legins probably 12 hours after eating is discentinued. The supply of food may be discontinued from ten to forty days, according to condition and temperament, without, in most cases, serious injury, and with great benefit in many, curing disease of long standing that may have resisted all other therapeutic means. Ample clinical evidence as well as sound physiological theory now support this position, though fasting should not be undertaken without proper direction, beyond four or five days. Perfect food nutrition requires that all the elements needed to maintain the bodily functions be supplied in due proportion, so that there may be no surplus to eliminate and no lack. This is an idea; condition probably never realized, even on a perfect food, certainly never on the ordinary mixed diet under the abnormal conditions of nervous excitement. But the body tissues supr's, by katabolism, the exact requirements; irritation is then reduced, elimination of poisonous food waste is obviated, the energy of digestion is saved and nature's forces are devoted to restoring normal conditions, which is always her purpose, figuratively speaking, as truly as rounding the dew
