**New Chinese Constitutional Cabinet Not Likely to Last.**

Pekin, Nov. 17.—China's first experiment with a constitutional cabinet dominated by Chinese does not promise much except as a stepping stone to something more permanent. The newspapers are not enthusiastic and express the opinion that the administration of Premier Yuan Shi Kai will be brief. Some of those selected as ministers already have declined to serve.

Suspicion exists in some quarters that Yuan deliberately constituted a government a continuation of which he knew to be impossible.
