American Ship is Torpedoed

Tanker Goes to the Bottom. No Word Received of Fate of Ship's Crew

Rome, Dec. 7.—The American oil steamer Communipaw has been sunk by a submarine in the Mediterranean near Tobruk, Tripoli. No information has been received concerning the crew or the nationality of the submarine.

The steamer Communipaw was recently held by the Italian government at Genoa, but was allowed to sail for her destination on December 2, owing to representations made to the government by the American embassy at Rome.

The Communipaw was owned by the Standard Oil Company of New Jersey and sailed from New York October 27 for Egypt.

The Communipaw formerly was the Deutschland flying the German flag and sailing from Hamburg. She was one of the steamers of the Standard Oil fleet which was transferred to American registry after the European war began.
