## Call For Republican Precinct Primaries

Republican precinct Primaries are hereby called to meet in the several precincts of Cache County, Utah, on Tuesday, August 1, 1916 at 8 o'clock p. m. for the purpose of electing delegates to the Republican State Convention and the Republican Congressional Convention for the First Congressional District of the State of Utah to be held at Ogden, Utah, on August 8, and August 9, 1916 respectively.

The Cache County Republican committee, in regular session assembled, by Resolution, duly passed, determined that the 39 delegates elected from Cache County to serve at the State Convention be elected as delegates for both conventions, and that 9 additional delegates be elected to serve in the Congressional Convention.

The apportionment of the delegates allotted to Cache County to the said conventions, is as follows, to-wit:

Logan—12 for both conventions; 3 additional delegates to Congressional convention.

The apportionment of said delegates to the State Convention is made on a basis of one delegate for each 90 votes cast for Senator Reed Smoot at the general election of 1914.

The apportionment to the Congressional Convention is made on a basis of one delegate for each 70 votes cast for Congressman Joseph Howell at the general election of 1914.

## EXAMINATION FOR POSTMASTER AT MENDON

The United States Civil Service Commission announces that on August 12, 1916, an examination will be held at Logan, Utah, as a result of which it is expected to make certification to fill a contemplated vacancy in the position of fourth class postmaster at Mendon, and other vacancies as they may occur at that office, unless it shall be decided in the interests of the service to fill the vacancy by reinstatement. The compensation of the postmaster at this office was \$343 for the last fiscal year.

Age limit 21 years and over on the date of the examination, with the exception that in a State where women are declared by statute to be of full age for all purposes at 18 years, women 18 years of age on the date of the examination will be admitted.

Applicants must reside within the territory supplied by the post office for which the examination is announced.

The examination is open to all citizens of the United States who can comply with the requirements.

Application forms and full information concerning the requirements of the examination can be secured from the postmaster at Mendon or from the U. S. Civil Service Commission, Washington, D. C.

Applications should be properly executed and filed with the Commission at Washington at least seven days before the date of the examination, otherwise it may be impracticable to examine the applicants.

### Call Is Issued For G. O. P. Meet

Six Hundred and Twenty-Four Delegates Will Have Seats. Apportionment is Set

The official call for the Republican state convention to be opened at 10 a. m. on August 8 at Ogden, has been issued by John K. Hardy, vice chairman and H. L. Cummings, secretary. The call contains the apportionment, which is based upon the vote cast for Senator Reed Smoot at the last election. This is the first time the apportionment has been based on the vote for senator. Heretofore it has been computed on the basis of the vote cast for governor.

The date was changed from August 9 to August 8 as the theater in which the convention is to be held could not be secured for August 9. Mr. Cummings said this agreement had been reached by the subcommittees.

There will be 624 delegates to the convention, under the apportionment made in the call. Of these Salt Lake county will have 187 and Weber county 60. The official call is as follows: "Headquarters Republican state committee, Salt Lake City, Utah, July 10, 1916.
