Amalgamated Sugar Company the Pioneers In Sugar Manufacture

The history of the Amalgamated Sugar Company runs parallel with the growth and development of the County of Cache. It is the hardy pioneer in sugar production in this county. It had a small beginning, but has kept pace with the growth and development of the county, and has consistently grown to its present mammoth proportions. It has not played the selfish role but at all times has been ready and willing to do its share in the development of the county along other lines, and work for the promotion of the public good.

Its first factory was built in Logan, immediately following the election of President McKinley. Its second factory was erected at Lewiston, and just recently the third installment in this very important branch of industry was erected at Smithfield. With this trio of plants it is the aim of the company to equalize its tonnage so that the sugar campaigns will begin and close at the same time, thus insuring no hardship upon a single individual.

Notwithstanding the late spring this season has produced more beets in the county than ever before, and the three factories will handle over 160,000 tons. In order to handle this immense tonnage with dispatch, and in order to provide convenience for the beet grower, the company has spared neither time nor money, and the latest loading devices are found all along the railroads at every station of consequence. Under such conditions the farmer can handle his crop on short order and with dispatch. And when it is realized that the operations of the company with these three Cache County factories extend from Avon on the south to McCammon in Idaho, on the north the decision is reached at once that without perfect organization, and the latest in machinery, the immense yearly crop could not be handled without great loss to all those concerned.

The company has been most fortunate in securing labor, and while in the beginning labor troubles were frequent, and at times labor was hard to get, the company has been successful in handling all problems of this kind.

The latest addition is the Smithfield factory, and coupled with its building is the extension of the O. L. & I. to most all of Lewiston, and other important sections west of Bear River, making connection with this new plant. It was through the influence of the Amalgamated Sugar Company that this extension was built, thus giving the beet growers in those sections of the county better facilities for the marketing of their crop, and at the same time adding material increases to the value of their land holdings. The Smithfield factory has cost

more than either of the others, due to the high cost of material. It is thoroughly modern and up-to-date and will easily care for its proportion of the tonnage in this section of the country.

The Amalgamated Sugar Company took a keen interest in the building and installation of the mammoth pumping plant on Bear River from which thousands of acres of heretofore arid lands will be irrigated. It has never considered its own business paramount to the interests of the community, and wherever it can consistently aid in the development of a community along other lines it is willing and ready to do so. It believes in growth and progress, and figures that the success of a community is an asset to its own business, and likewise a failure in a community is nothing more nor less than an indirect liability of its own.

The company says that the price of beets for next year is to be \$8.50 per ton. It looks with a great deal of satisfaction on its success in the beet seed venture, and has every reason to believe that within a short time it will be taking care of its own needs, and have a surplus for the commercial trade.
