DEMOCRACY VS. CLASS DICTATION

In view of the lamentable experience of Los Angeles and Southern California in the recent railway strike when 98 per cent of the population was dominated by and made subservient to, less than 2 per cent of the population on strike, the Los Angeles business men in the interest of public welfare, urge the inauguration of a national movement designed to prevent such disastrous situations in the future.

Although successful in isolating Los Angeles from the rest of the country, the less than 2 per cent of the population on strike were unable to agree on a unanimous doubtless to agree among themselves. Although the strikers on the steam railway all were members of the railroad organizations having contracts with the governments of the United States these contractors were violated and national organizations and officers

were ignored and acting on their own initiative as individuals, a few thousand men paralyzed rail transportation because of their sympathies with an attempted tie-up on local railway lines.

The Los Angeles Chamber of Commerce believes that so long as such a condition may exist and if nothing is done to prevent similar disastrous repetitions, our people are failing to function as a democracy. So long as one class or organization, representing only a small minority of the population, is able to restrict at will the peace and enterprise of the population, there is danger of the entire country having at any time exactly what Los Angeles had to contend with.

The people of Los Angeles feel that the public would welcome a national movement to make it a criminal offense for two or more persons engaged in public utility work to enter into a conspiracy to render impotent such an industry, in order to compel

settlement of grievances of a class. Legislation should be framed to apply alike to workers and owners of such utilities.

For the protection of the public, a public utility workman, official and owner, should assume a stated obligation, the same as does a soldier or sailor in the government service.

The idea is to unify the masses who are sufferers from strikes and bring home to them that it is within their power to prevent small minorities from disturbing the productivity of well ordered communities by establishing a just penalty for the reckless and often criminal few who inspire others to force their disintegrating radicalism upon organized effort.

Los Angeles is taking the initiative in such a movement if sanctioned by public sentiment, to free cities and communities from class, dictation, community cabotage and the policies of force and destructiveness.

DOES LABOR WANT WRECKAGE

It would look that way. In Spokane the electrical workers propose to parallel the interurban lines with jitney buses and wreck them financially.

The interurban lines between Centralia and Chehalis have been losing money for years and all efforts to put them on a paying basis are resisted by organized labor.

The Lewis County Central Trades council now comes out flatly in favor of wrecking the properties of unregulated jitney competition against the North Coast Power company.

It takes the position that the jitney driver's union should not be discriminated against, also advocates public ownership of the interurban lines and let the taxpayers assume deficits instead of people who ride.

One of the first steps under public ownership would be to raise the rates and make the interurbans an ironclad monopoly, which shows the unfairness of the proposition.

It is not in the interest of labor of any kind to have broken down utilities or wrecked industries of any sort. It is the slogan of the I. W. W. and community sabotage

BY PRODUCT OF HIGH TYING UP THE OIL PRODUCTION WAGES

A by product of excessive wage demand its introduction of labor saving machinery.

Street railway employes put up demands that substitute ten thousand one-man safety cars.

Pressmen demands compel attachment of self feeding devices to all kinds of job presses.

In scores of lines manufacturers are compelled to displace labor with labor saving devices.

The household servant problem has done the same in thousands of homes and has caused the sale of electric flat irons, washing machines, vacuum cleaners, sewing machines, cooking apparatus and other household electric appliances in unprecedented volume.

More goods of this kind are being sold throughout the country in a single month than were sold in 12 months a few years ago.

Temperature of Leaves.

Some recent investigation of the temperature of leaves made in the deserts and mountains of Arizona and in the Santa Lucia mountains of California have resulted in the discovery that leaves show a very rapid change of temperature at times. These fluctuations are almost constantly going on. Changes of from 1 to 3 degrees centigrade were observed in from twenty to sixty seconds, and if a moderately strong wind is blowing the change may amount to 5 degrees in thirty seconds.

What do the official classes care whether we are running short on oil and oil products or not so long as they can draw salaries.


Government has become an awful nightmare in more ways than one, and is the principle obstacle to return to normal condition.
