A NEW UNDERWORLD THEME IN FILM AT THE LYRIC

The crook dramas of recent years that are really great may be counted upon the fingers of one hand or nipped with one breath. But a place among them is carved by the newest story of the underworld. It is "Outside the Law," a film feature with a limited run, and produced by Ted Drowart, in which Priscilla Dean is starring on the screen at the Lyric Theatre this week.

The struggle of crooks to go straight is an old theme—but the struggle of Silky Moll and Digger Bill Ballard to live their own lives is a part, but not the theme, of "The Browning" picture. It is merely the dramatic skeleton that sustains the comely flesh of human heart drama in which Miss Dean, Len Chaney and Wanda Oakman are the principals.

The real theme runs through the story like the undercurrent of a turbulent river. It is the passion of an old Chinese philosopher for his ideals—principles of right and wrong that are fundamental and not accretions and paragraphs from quibbling statute books. In his oriental devotion to what is right, E. A. Warren shows the Chinese dealing a justice "outside the law."

A young star named Stanley Gooden, Ralph Lewis, Melbourne MacDowell and Wilton Taylor are exceedingly well cast in important roles.

SILVER CART WHEELS ON THE WAY

The coinage of silver dollars is being resumed at the Philadelphia mint the first that have been put into circulation since 1905. In 1918 the Pittman act fixed \$1 an ounce as the price at which the purchases of silver should be made. The price of silver in the open market is about sixty cents an ounce. Treasury officials state that about 350,000,000 silver dollars will be coined—enough so that everybody will have some of them.
