Some complaint is being made; and fault found with the city council on account of their intention to assess a frontage tax for the laying of the water mains, notice of which appears in the pages of The Record. The course the council is taking in this matter is the only legal one, and is in the interest of all concerned. The funds available for the water works are not sufficient to admit of pipes being laid along all the streets of our city at present, otherwise the tax would include all the frontage in town. It is probable that the owners of property along the course of the proposed line are dissatisfied on account of being taxed while those whose premises do not abut on this line are not taxed. To us it seems that if any one is out of luck it is those passed whose homes the pipe line is not to be laid at present. There is nothing more certain than that the close proximity of the water main will enhance the value of the property it passes, much more than the amount of the tax; and if ever the other property in the city gets a like convenience it will have a like expense to meet. The preparation that is being made for the assessing of this tax is one of the best signs that we have had that the council are moving in the matter of installing the water system. If however the owners of the property to be taxed by this move are opposed to the proposition, a protest signed by persons representing the ownership of two thirds of the frontage of the property to be taxed, presented to the city council at any time before the time set by the council for the consideration of the levy, will operate as a stay of proceedings. It should be understood while the whole of the property of the city is held for the payment of the bonds which the city will issue to procure the necessary funds for the putting in of this water system, it is not at all probable that any direct tax will be required to pay the indebtedness.
