FIRST FEED FOR THE CHICKS

Mixture of Equal Parts of Hard-Boiled Eggs and Stale Bread is Recommended.

(Prepared by the United States Department of Agriculture.)

For the first three days chicks may be fed a mixture of equal parts hard-boiled eggs and stale bread, or stale bread soaked in milk. When bread and milk are used, care should be exercised to squeeze all milk out of the bread. From the third or fourth day until the chicks can eat wheat and cracked corn commercial chick feed is a good ration.

POULTRY NOTES

Avoid drafts.

Plenty of grit is necessary.

Supply sufficient ventilation.

Supply plenty of clean, pure water.

Severely hot weather is hard on little chicks.

Keep the henhouse clean and don't permit the droppings to accumulate.

Separate any hens that show symptoms of disease from the rest of the flock.

Little turkeys do best when they don't leave the shell until green grass appears.

If purchasing an incubator get the best. A cheap machine is usually the most expensive.

The only way to find the hens that lay a large number of eggs is to keep a record as determined by trap nests.

Every well-managed farm should have a pen of carefully selected breeders to supply eggs for hatching.

Supply plenty of pure food and avoid impure food and soured mash. These cause diseases of the digestive system.

Sometimes little chicks will pick up so much grit that their crops become packed with it and there is no room for the feed to be digested.
