The same section also provides that if a member of the association is expelled from the aforesaid association for any cause, that the company shall dismiss him from its employ. It simply means that Mr. Pratt and a few other walking delegates and fakirs shall dictate absolutely who an employer shall employ, in other words the walking delegates take charge of his business.

Mr. Bancroft, we think, made a mistake in the first instance in having anything whatever to do with this Mr. Pratt, and we further think that Mr. Pratt had better return to the place from whence he came. He and his backers will injure the cause of the employes of not only this street car company but of any concern with any sense of independence and a desire to run their own business, in whose affairs they meddle. An agitator like Pratt, who rejoiced in the classic title of Demoli or Tomale, or something of that sort, came along here a year or two ago to raise havoc with the coal industry: the same as he and some others had succeeded in doing in Colorado, where they created a reign of terror, murder and anarchy. Heber M. Wells was then Governor of this State and by prompt and decisive action put a quietus on Demoli and saved the state from atrocities similar to those perpetrated in Colorado. Mr. Pratt should consider the fate of Mr. Demoli and co-conspirators.
