TENTH FEDERAL RESERVE BOARD BANK IS RAPPED

KANSAS CITY, May 1.—Assertion that the tenth federal reserve bank board has made loans to "non-essential industries" until funds are not available to cattle growers is contained in a resolution sent the governor of the federal reserve board yesterday following a conference here of livestock interests.

Ambitious Youths of Ogden Attacks on Members of Catholic Orders in Mexico Related to Committee

WASHINGTON, May 1.—Attacks on members of Catholic orders in Mexico during the Carranza rebellion and the looting of schools, hospitals, churches and other establishments under their control were described before the senate Mexican investigating committee today by Monsignor Francis C. Kelly, president of the Catholic Extension society of the United States.

Conditions became so bad, he said, that a general exodus of Catholic orders from Mexico occurred. Women frequently were outrageously abused, the witness declared.
