

J. U. Eldredge, Jr., Honored By Colleagues at Chicago Caucus; Utahns on Job But Saying Little

(Special Despatch.) CHICAGO, June 8.—Headed by Senator Reed Smoot, an unwavering supporter of the Lodge Resolution program in the senate, the Utah delegates will undoubtedly support this plank in the platform.

Utah Headquarters, Great Northern Hotel, Chicago, June 8.—Ernest Bamberger of Salt Lake was unanimously chosen national committeeman for Utah at yesterday's caucus of the Utah delegates to the Republican national convention.

Senator Smoot was elected chairman of the delegation, and J. U. Eldredge Jr., of Ogden was elected secretary.

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And the reporter "doped" just right. Senator Smoot made a short talk to the delegates today and explained to them the tactical advantage Utah holds because of the rule that state delegations shall vote in alphabetical order.

Excites Comment The expulsion of two Missouri delegates who confessed taking \$2500 each of Lowden money was the topic of much conversation around headquarters, and has served more than any other one thing to quiet any inclination on the part of Utah delegates elected as they were on an uninducted platform, to keep close-mouthed as to the individual preferences.

Ernest Bamberger and E. R. Woolley were guests at a banquet given members of the Republican ways and means committee.

Utahns who registered at the headquarters today, exclusive of delegates and alternates are former Governor and Mrs. William Spry, D. S. Spencer, Ernest Bamberger, Glen Miller, Bishop Joseph S. Glass, A. S. Lewis, W. E. Williams, Rodney Badger, Henry Welsh, chairman, Allan Martineau and John E. Holden; Charles Hollingsworth of Ogden, Clair Anderson of Manti, and President Heber J. Grant of the L. D. S. church.

All-delegates and all but two alternates, J. Farley White of Salt Lake, and James Knudson of Brigham City, are expected Tuesday.

Distinct Honor Mrs. Hyde, who holds a distinct honor among the women delegates attending the convention, will take her place on the platform on the convention tomorrow as one of the three assistant secretaries of the convention.
