PEARL CASEY IS OGDEN VISITOR

Old Time Baseball Star of State League Drops in on Friends

Pearl Casey, one time Ogden baseball star, and later a star in the Pacific Coast league, was an Ogden visitor Monday. Casey had a wonderful record as a baseball star, playing the position with the class of a Doyle.

His record in brief follows: Casey was brought to Ogden by "Dad" Gimlin, and played with the team as a second baseman from 1903 to 1907, which year he joined the Tacoma Tigers in the Pacific Coast league, and which team was managed by the famous "Mique" Fisher, and whose fame was really made by Casey.

When the Tacoma club disbanded, Casey joined the Portland club, and continued with this club as second baseman until he injured his leg, which injury forced his retirement from the game. He then took charge of the Portland club as manager during the period that Walter McCreedy had charge of the Salt Lake club. Retiring from this position he accepted the position as umpire in the Pacific Coast league, which he has held for the past two years.

Casey was only 18 years old when he joined the Ogden club, but at this age he was a finished ball player with lots of speed in the country when he played here, and was somewhat taken back when he found that the fans had allowed baseball to become a dead issue for the past four or five years.
