He can afford to laugh. For the people are buying the ouija boards he makes so fast that he's rolling in money.

"They'll bite on anything," he continues. "The public belief in the ouija board is a joke. We don't foster it. But the poor deluded fools want the board and we're giving it to them by the thousands."

The past year 500,000 ouija boards were sold by J. M. Simmons & Co., made in a little second-floor factory with 10 employees on Chicago's West Side. Simmons said as many more were sold by the William Field company of Baltimore.

OHIO SENATORIAL RACE IS GETTING VERY CLOSE

COLUMBUS, O., Aug. 12.—Straggling returns today rendered still more uncertain the outcome of the contest between W. A. Julian of Cincinnati, and Judge A. F. O'Neil of Akron, for the Democratic nomination for United States senator.

With 5559 precincts heard from, out of 6000, O'Neil's lead was only 299 votes. The count now stands: Julian 59,951; O'Neil 62,500.

Returns received this morning made no material change in the other counts.

MEXICO IS DONE WITH FIGHTING

General Outlines Ambitious Program for Rehabilitation of Country

NEW YORK, Aug. 12.—Mexico is done with revolutions and has embarked on a program of development which will surprise the world, General Salvador Alvarado, publisher of El Herald of Mexico City and secretary of the treasury in the provisional government, told members of the Pan-American divisions of the Associated Advertising Clubs of the World here today.

He pictured an ambitious program for the rehabilitation of Mexico, first among which was reorganization of the nation's banking system, creation of a merchant marine, and employment for thousands of men who have made a living fighting.

With a revival of general business, the general predicted a fertile field in Mexico for advertising.

He denied that there was widespread anti-American feeling in Mexico.

"We are your sincere friends," he declared. "We adore your strength, your vigor, your enterprise, your system, your wonderful discipline of mind and body, and we are eager to assimilate your methods."

"We resent, naturally, antagonism shown by certain isolated groups, but taking the United States as a whole, we have nothing but friendship."

He said that the government is prepared to spend \$25,000,000 for American railroad equipment. He said the government was planning to expand for public works, schools and other improvements, sums previously spent in maintaining military forces. An army only large enough for defense will be maintained, he said.

BOLSHEVIK DIVISIONS SHAMMER GEN. WRANGEL

CONSTANTINOPLE, Aug. 10.—Bolshevik forces in southern Russia are striking at the extreme flanks of General Baron Wrangel's army north of the Crimean peninsula, according to dispatches received here.

Three soviet divisions, totaling 6000, crossed the Dnieper river on August 7 at Aleshki, and advanced several versts southward. Two bolshevik cavalry columns, supported by infantry, are advancing southward from Alexandrovsk.

IOWA DEMOCRATS ARE MEETING IN HARMONY

SIoux CITY, Ia., Aug. 12.—Peace and harmony are expected to rule at the state Democratic judicial convention which opened here today to select nominees for the November election for four year places on the state supreme court.

Persons following the situation said it was likely John W. Anderson, former district judge of Woodbury county, probably would be one of the three nominees and that the Des Moines delegation would probably name one man and eastern Iowa Democrats the other.

PITTSBURGH, Kan., Aug. 12.—Learning that several motor cars loaded with members of a Fort Scott mob intent on lynching had passed through Arma, eight miles north of Bourbe county, left Pittsburg this morning with a negro who last night shot a white man at Fort Scott.
