

N. Y. Woman to Lecture On Italian Aims At Hermitage



MISS LILA VAN KIRK

"Italy and the Adriatic Question," with special reference to the port of Fiume, will be the subject of an address to be given Monday evening at the Hermitage hotel by Miss Lila Van Kirk of New York, who is recognized as an authority on things connected with Italy and the Italians.

Miss Van Kirk, in addition to having several years of experience as a settlement worker among Italians in this country, has also been a resident of Italy and has come to appreciate the view point of the Italians in matters regarding their country. It is said.

She has lectured in various parts of the United States on the same subject which she will present at the Hermitage, and an important portion of her discussion will deal with the claims and counterclaims of Italy and the Jugoslavians.

Her topic is timely, and the lecture which she will present will be brought more forcibly before her audience, it is said, by reason of the slides and illustrations which will be projected upon a screen. The pictures, which include a number of maps relative to her talk, were presented to Miss Van Kirk by the Italian government, following her resignation as a member of the Italian Bureau of Information, upon which she served during the late war.

Miss Van Kirk is a landscape painter of no mean ability and it was in study of this art that she became intimately associated with Italian people.

Edward O. Baker of Shanghai Drops in at Weber Club

Edward O. Baker, secretary of the chamber of commerce with headquarters at Shanghai, China, was an Ogden visitor yesterday en route to the east from San Francisco where he attended the convention of the International Council of Commercial Economies. He was one of three delegates to the convention at San Francisco from the orient.

Baker, while in Ogden, visited points of interest here, including the Hermitage in Ogden canyon and paid a visit to the Weber club before departing for the east. He praised the local chamber of commerce for the work it is doing in this section and spoke very highly of its enterprise, humanitarianism and cordiality.

En route to his post in China, Baker will visit the principal cities of the United States where he will study the up-to-date methods of the various chambers of commerce associations in this country.

Salt Aid in Keeping Livestock in Herds

That salt is an important factor in controlling the movements of cattle on the range, was a statement made by C. N. Woods, grazing expert at the forest service headquarters.

Mr. Woods, in answer to comment on the part of Assistant Forester Barnes, who expressed an opinion that too much time in salting cattle was spent by forest officials, stated that this task is not carried out near as much as it should be.

By distribution of salt, cattle can be confined to certain areas with success. Through liberal sprinkling of salt on lower ranges, the cattle are kept from making their way to higher ranges, thus allowing forage plants to thrive and become more serviceable as feed.

In a like manner, cattle can be made to graze areas that they would otherwise pass over, Mr. Woods claims.

Because of the fact that new permittees are allowed grazing privileges each year, forest officials have to be vigilant in seeing that the new permittees salt their stock and thus control the movement of the cattle over restricted range.

Mr. Woods says that the fondness of cattle for salt causes them to linger near places where it is most available.
