**Western Tourists
Starting Homeward**

Passenger travel continues to be heavy on west bound trains out of Ogden. Yesterday train 19, west bound, carried nineteen cars totaling more than 700 passengers, while the same train out of Ogden today carried more than 500 passengers, or two sections having seventeen cars.
Thousands of western tourists, who have been visiting in the east, are expected to start their return journeys to the west during the first part of the coming week, according to Depotmaster Tracy.
The majority of these tourists have tickets purchased several weeks ago and unless they start their journey west before August 25, the increase of 20 per cent will be added to the old scale before they depart on their return journey.
Seventy-three tourists en route to Yellowstone National park from the east will arrive in Ogden tomorrow and will spend more than six hours in Ogden before departing for the west. The tenth party of twelve traveling from Chicago to Yellowstone will arrive here next week.

**J. H. Myers Dies
of Heart Failure**

Joseph H. Myers, taxi driver stationed on the Eccles building corner, died suddenly last night of heart failure at his residence, 750 Washington avenue.
Mr. Myers had worked all day and in the evening had driven members of his family to Riverdale and back. Arriving home he complained of feeling ill and leaving the car started to enter the house. He sank upon the porch and expired before medical aid could be summoned.
Mr. Myers was a saloon keeper in the old Eccles building for a number of years. He was 71 years old.
A daughter living in Tucson, Ariz., had left that town for Cuba, a telegram advised Kirkendall undertaking establishment this morning. Burial arrangements will be held up pending word from her.

**Highway Engineer at
Salt Lake Meeting**

W. N. Frickstad, senior highway engineer of the United States Department of Public Roads, offices here, attended the meeting of the state's road commission at Salt Lake today, according to B. J. Finch, district engineer.
Bids for the Price-Castle Gate road were opened today by the state road commission. Work on this road will be started with the awarding of the contract to be completed this fall.
Engineer Frickstad will depart from Salt Lake today for southern Utah where he will make a final inspection of the Delta-Holden project. The construction of the road from Kanab to Hurricane was also discussed at the meeting.

**Japanese Released
Under \$1000 Bail**

Sannamon Katayama, 20-year-old Japanese, who was arrested at the Grant hotel on August 19, following receipt of information from immigration officials by the Ogden police department, was released this morning after payment of \$1,000 bail which was furnished by countrymen of the prisoner.
Katayama, according to information received at the police station, deserted ship at Newport News and has no passports to this country. Immigration officials are to take charge of the matter.

**BEGIN WORK ON
ROAD IN CANYON**

Moran Workers Make Preliminary Tests; Officials Make Inspection

Preliminary work for the paving of Ogden canyon road has begun. Men under direction of the Moran Paving company this morning began cutting test holes in the old pavement near the mouth of the canyon to determine the depth of the old road base and their work marked the beginning of actual steps to place the new pavement.

Within two weeks the "hot stuff," or bituminous surface will be flowing, according to announcement made this morning in the local office of the state road commission.

State road officials of Salt Lake and Ogden and P. J. Moran went on an inspection tour of the road yesterday and Mr. Moran sprung the surprise that his company would probably complete the road surfacing before winter. Under the contract he is given 200 days.

HERMITAGE STRETCH.
As planned yesterday the first stretch will be laid near the Hermitage hotel and the pavement will be laid in both directions. The work is being planned so that canyon traffic may not be interrupted only at short intervals and vehicles will be delayed but little while the entire stretch is being laid. It was said.

Joseph Ririe, state auditor, Ira Browning, state road engineer, Reuben Simpson and E. E. Grimes of the local road office, accompanied Mr. Moran on the inspection trip yesterday afternoon. Locations where gravel and other materials may be obtained for the road were mapped out near Idlewild and the mouth of the canyon.

EQUIPMENT ON WAY.
Several carloads of equipment have been sent to the scene of action by the Moran company and are ready for unloading. Three cars are now on the Idlewild siding and another car near the mouth of the canyon.
It is predicted that within two weeks the equipment will be in place and the "hot stuff" will be pouring on the road bed.

**Court Hangers-on Get
Laugh From Auto Case**

Spectators had a smile or two at the city court this morning as the case of Ezra Peterson was heard. Peterson, arrested for a mix-up in license plates on three different cars, appeared yesterday in the city court, and his case was taken under advisement by Judge D. R. Roberts until this morning.
County Attorney Joseph B. Bates asked permission to speak a few words in behalf of the defendant and attempted to show that the complaint charging Peterson with the offense was not sufficient to convict him. The complaint, Bates contended, allowed the prisoner no chance at explanation.

Following Attorney Bates' argument, Peterson asked permission to say a few words and for a few moments speaking in rapid-fire order, he vividly presented his case. During the greater portion of his argument he told of three automobiles, two trucks and a roadster, and at the conclusion of his remarks, all present were somewhat confused as to the status of the cars.
Judge Roberts found the defendant guilty. He denied a motion on the part of Attorney Bates for a stay of execution and fined Peterson \$20.
A five-day suspension of sentence was granted and it is understood that Peterson will appeal the case.

**One More Day Left to
Get Old Rate Tickets**


Tourists en route to other points from Ogden will have one more opportunity to purchase tickets under the present rate, which will be increased 20 per cent Thursday, according to Thompson Corb, general ticket agent at the Union depot. Tickets purchasing tickets for various points of the country with non-stop rules enforced, will be allowed to travel to their destination's end on the present rate of mileage provided the tickets are purchased tomorrow and providing the passenger or passengers depart on their journey August 25.
The new rates will become effective August 26th and will be increased 20 per cent, the increase being granted a few weeks ago. The new rates will effect every state in the country, but it is not expected that passenger travel will be hampered through the new increases. It is said.
