AIR SMUGGLER PUZZLES POLICE

PAU, France, Sept. 2.—(Correspondence.)—A polished gentleman wearing the full regalia of an aviator and presenting a pilot's certificate entered the shops of an airplane works here a few days ago and expressed a desire to purchase an airplane. Accompanied by a representative of the firm he evaded over the Pau field in various machines, showing great virtuosity in aerial gymnastics, loops, the loop, sliding on the wing, do-

ing the falling leaf and other stunts until he decided to purchase a biplane, for which he gave a certified check as payment. He then flew away.

In a field near San Sebastian, Spain, yesterday, there was found an abandoned airplane in which there was a satchel containing several thousand francs in French silver and gold pieces.

A polished gentleman wearing the full regalia of an aviator had been seen to leave the plane a few minutes after it landed, carrying heavy grips of the same type as the one left in the plane. No one returned for the third grip and it has been confiscated by the Spanish authorities.

The Pau airplane firm has notified the Aero club of France and the Service of European Aerial Navigation to be on the lookout for an aerial smuggler.

Electricity Offers Many Conveniences

There are more than 5000 Utah homes not yet wired in territory served by electrical central stations, according to figures in the July number of Electrical Merchandising. While this figure is low compared to the proportionate population of Utah and other states, still it shows that a great many people of the state are not availing themselves of the comforts and conveniences brought to the home by electricity, according to C. C. Campbell, sales manager of the Inter-Mountain Electric company.

"Of the homes wired," said Mr. Campbell, "the great majority are not provided with sufficient number of connecting places for appliances. Whenever it is desired to connect a fan, or an iron, or washing machine, the housewife has to reach up and unscrew a globe from the chandelier and then screw in the plug of whatever appliance is to be used. This is a waste of time and energy and is particularly inconvenient.

"Little brass plates put in the floor wall or baseboard in a few minutes' time by an expert electrician, arranged in the most convenient places so that any appliance can be used without disturbing anything else, will prove to be worth many times their cost in added utility and comfort. Architects designing new homes make provision for them. And whether it be a new house in course of construction, or an old one, experts can be easily obtained who will put in the wiring, or extend it to accommodate new outlets. An electrical construction job of whatever nature about the house will be done quickly and efficiently by men from your electrical dealer."

Belgium Uses Many Electrical Appliances

America has found a big market for its products in Belgium. This is particularly true of electric appliances such as electric washers, heating appliances, storage batteries and wiring devices.

The recent commercial exhibition at Brussels Park, near the palace of King Albert, made a special feature of a display of these appliances. The king himself took a keen interest in this display and spent much time in inspecting the section devoted to American electrical wares.

An organization whose chief work is the development of the country's utilities selected the wares that were shown from among the products of leading manufacturers of Europe and America. This organization, the Societe d'Electricite et de Mecanique, is playing a leading part in the valiant struggle Belgium is making to get back to its pre-war prosperity.

Factories and farms are being restored rapidly in Belgium, but not on their pre-war basis. All agree that the restoration should be on a more efficient basis than ever before attained, so several of the larger farms in areas devastated during the war have been equipped with complete sets of American labor-saving appliances.

CONTROVERSY ENDED.
MANILA, P. I., Aug. 21.—(Correspondence.)—A long standing controversy between the city of Manila and the Insular government as to the ownership of the walls which surround the ancient city and the sunken gardens around the walls, has just been decided in favor of the Insular government. The attorney general of the Philippine Islands to whom the question was submitted held that the Insular government was the rightful owner of the properties. It has been arranged, however, to turn over to the city of Manila the sunken garden to be used as a playground.

U. S. Leads World in Electric Appliances

Few people realize that the electric heating appliance industry of the United States preeminently leads the world. The progressive women of the world are inclined to look upon the American made electric appliances in the same way as they regard hats and gowns and French creations.

American electrical goods are the vogue, and set the standard in all civilized countries. The rapid international development of this industry and the speed at which it has attained its world prominence is particularly indicative of the initiative of the American people. The labor saving advantages, the convenience and utility of American made electrical appliances such as electric washers, electric cleaners, sewing machines, electric irons, have appealed very strongly to the American women, and in the stress of present day servant shortage they have been quick to utilize these advantages. In homes where they are now obliged to get along with one servant instead of several, the electrical appliances have proved of untold value.

America Leads in Canning of Foods

That the canning industry has become a unique American institution, is a thought suggested by such displays as that of Pierce's canned products seen at the Standard-Examiner's cooking school this week. In fact, these American preserved foods have played an important part in world reconstruction since the war.

"It is doubtful if the impoverished cities of Europe could so quickly regained normal food conditions without these American canned products," said H. L. Herrington, president of the Utah Canning company, in a conversation on this subject. "Even this year immense quantities of preserved vegetables, meats and fruits are being exported to England, France and Germany."

"America developed the best methods of preserving these foods and will continue to lead the world in output so long as she leads the world in the production of the basic foods. Methods may be copied, but we have here the meats, fruits and vegetables, and they cannot be canned quite near to the place where they grow."

Electric Cleaner Has Many Household Uses

By this time most every one is familiar with the fact that an electric cleaner will clean house faster than by the broom and dusting method. Practically every modern housewife is convinced that it is more sanitary to have a dust hat absorb dirt than to disseminate it into the surrounding atmosphere, watch it settle on furniture then chase it off again. But many folks are still unaware that a modern electric cleaner has a whole repertoire of unusual uses.

There are the furs and fall apparel that need airing and dusting now. Bring the cleaner into use and let it freshen up the furs. Winter hats can be rejuvenated and winter coats, velvets and other heavy materials that always look a little mussed when taken out of the boxes where they have been stored.

If the hot air register refuses to work on the first cold day, it is probably clogged with dirt. Let the electric cleaner remove the dirt; hot air will then rush forth when the furnace fire is started. Suppose you have a large box to clean. Is it not easier to insert the hose and long tube of an electric cleaner than to do the work by hand? If you have been on a long automobile trip and the upholstery of the car is covered with dust, this electric cleaner will get the dust, thus restoring the color without the necessity of tiresome hand brushing. Perhaps one of the best things a cleaner does is to pick up the threads and ravelings from the sewing room floor after the day's sewing is done.

Now Have Electric Fruit Juice Extractor

Since strong drinks have been barred, the soda fountain with its assortment of soft drinks has become increasingly popular and the orange juice drink holds high place in popular favor. Formerly the juice had to be extracted by hand on a small glass bulb or in a small crude machine, operated by hand, but now if you stroll into a modern restaurant place you will see on one end of the soda bar the new electrical aid for orange drinks.

"An orange, please," you say to the white-clad clerk. He selects an orange, halves it, puts one half on the aluminum bulb of the motor-driven juice extractor, places a glass beneath the spout to receive the juice, and in a jiffy all of the juice is extracted quickly and cleanly within view of the customer.

"Plain water or vichy?" asks the clerk. "Vichy," you reply, and he adds a little chilled ice, then fills up the glass with vichy and places before you a frothy, delicious pure juice drink so good in fact that you wonder if there can be anything better.

This new electrical juice extractor consists of a vertically mounted motor carrying an aluminum extracting bulb at the upper end. The whole is mounted in a housing made of copper and finished in polished silver plate. The bulb is surrounded by a metal basin, which catches the juice as it is so swiftly extracted and pours it into the spout, which in turn delivers the juice to the glass underneath.

VALUABLE FOXES.

GRASS VALLEY, Cal., Sept. 28.—Two pairs of silver grey foxes, worth, it is claimed, between \$3,000 to \$5,000 a pair, are to be brought from Prince Edward Islands, on the Inside Passage to Alaska, to a fox farm recently established on the east shore of Lake Tahoe. William Lewis, one of the owners of the farm, left recently for the north to get the animals. Of the four silver grey foxes brought to the farm last winter, two escaped, one of which was later killed in the wilds by a hunter.
