

Bean Buyer for Ogden Concern Is Busy Man

When it comes to being a rare bean the Mexican "brincadore," or jumping bean, has nothing on the conventional kind that goes into canned products for American tables. According to H. L. Herrington, president of the Utah Canning company, the products of which are being used at the Standard-Examiner's cooking school this week, no Mexican pean comes nearer to worship in the pursuit of a mere bean than the man who buys beans in the world's markets for this Utah company.

"This buyer spends all his time chasing beans around the globe," says Mr. Herrington. "When he learns of an exceptional crop in Manchuria, for instance, he goes there at once. It is his duty to provide every year the world's most perfect bean for our canned products."

"Of course, we cannot depend entirely upon nature when we aim at perfect regularity in size and development. All beans are carefully picked over at our factory and the 'culis' thrown out. The Manchurian bean is now one of the best crops to be had anywhere and we are using large quantities of them."

Use of Electrical Equipment Is Shown

Unique as one of the features of the Standard-Examiner cooking school yesterday was the serving of Murphy's Hotel Utah coffee and toast made from American-Maid bread, both prepared by use of the electrical household equipment on exhibit at the cooking school. The demonstration of this and other electrical equipment was made by Miss Valine Quinney, representing the electrical companies of Ogden.

A large percolator, electric toaster and electric grill were utilized, the very tastiest of foods being thus prepared.

Electrical goods at the show have been arranged in a display which is attracting much attention. To provide room for this display without interfering with the large attendance at the school, a portion of the corridor at the entrance to the cooking school auditorium has been utilized. In this display are electric ranges, irons, washers, vacuum cleaners, sewing machine, percolators, grills, hot plates, flat irons, toasters and other electrical devices that are conveniences for any home, economies of both time, labor and money.


