Smith; assistant secretary-treasurer, Dr. Merrill.

#### ANNUAL REPORT.

Among the features of the program was the annual report presented by James H. Wallis, executive secretary. Tuberculosis cannot be controlled in Utah without the cooperation of all public health officials. Therefore, the Public Health Association is concerned not only with those who are actually suffering with tuberculosis, but with all its means of prevention. The coordination of all health activities will bring about the most economic use of such agencies. To this end the association is seeking to cooperate in every way possible with educational and medical activities and with state, county and city organizations.

It is now the quite general opinion of medical and public health authorities that, knowing the nature of tuberculosis, how it is caused and transmitted, and how to cure for and prevent it, the big task is to educate people generally regarding it. Such is the work of the Utah Public Health Association.

#### SEAL SALE DISCUSSED.

The Christmas seal sale has as its primary purpose an educational campaign and as its secondary purpose the financial returns, according to William B. Buck, western representative of the National Tuberculosis Association, who spoke in the lobby of the 1920 session. "The public health movement in the state of Utah has reached most gratifying proportions," Mr. Buck said. "It is accomplishing this largely through the service of its public health nurses." The public health nurse was discussed by Miss Lennie B. Arthur, state supervising nurse, and the particular work of the association was presented by Miss Sophie K. Larsen, of Ogden, under whose supervision a tuberculosis survey is being made of Weber county. Miss Larsen reported finding seventy-one cases of the disease in Weber that had not been reported by any other agency in the county.

The financial report was given by Horace H. Smith and the history of the first seal sale in the state, that of 1911, was given by Mrs. A. J. Gorham.

Members of the association from all parts of the state were present.

### Name Guardian in Annulment Suit

Judge A. W. Ages of the district court has appointed John C. Child as guardian ad litem of his minor child, Delbert Child, defendant in a pending suit brought by the parents of his wife to annul his marriage to their daughter.

As a result of Judge Ages' action the complaint in the annulment suit will be amended and the father will be named as defendant instead of his son.

Mr. and Mrs. Nathan P. Gray brought the suit to court to secure the annulment of the marriage of their daughter, Aileen Gray, to Delbert Child, alleging that the girl was only 15 years of age when she was married. The case has attracted considerable attention owing to the strenuous efforts made at times by Child to see his wife.

### Compensation Case To Supreme Court

The case of Ogden city against Mrs. Alice Smalley was taken to the supreme court yesterday on application for a writ of review of the proceedings of the industrial commission.

Through a divided award of the latter body, Mrs. Smalley was awarded \$1452.52. The son, a former Ogden motorcycle patrolman, died from injuries alleged to have been sustained while in service of the police department.

The city holds that the mother was not shown to be dependent on the son.

### POSTAL DELEGATES FLEE HORRORS OF BULL RING
