BRAVES CHIEF OGDEN VISITOR

George Stallings Pays Tribute to Comiskey for Ousting Bribe Takers

George Stallings, manager of the Boston Braves in the National League, was an Ogdens visitor today on route to the coast. Stallings was accompanied by Fred W. Pearson, secretary of the Braves.

That some action must be taken immediately for the protection of baseball was the opinion expressed by Stallings and Pearson while in this city.

The recent scandal which developed in the Chicago club of the American league has hurt baseball to some extent," said Stallings, "but in my opinion in the future the game will be better than ever, at least when the heads of the various clubs thresh out the trouble and make some arrangement that will safeguard the game."

"Charlie Comiskey of the Chicago club is one of the greatest characters in baseball and when he 'canned' the men involved in the scandal he threw more than \$200,000 in American money into the streets. The players in my opinion were worth that much, but the 'Old Roman' did it for the good of the game and believe me I surely admire him for his action. It may take years and years to rebuild the crumpled machine but when it is repaired it will be a machine for clean baseball and not an undermined club like the one which lost the 1913 world series."

"In the opinion of eastern sport writers no punishment is too great for the men involved in the scandal. Some of the players on the team, especially Felsch, Williams, McMullen and Risher, were just getting in their prime," said Pearson, "and their careers in the game are now ruined. They are done absolutely in organized baseball."

"Just what the penalty for the players involved will be can not be determined until the Cook county grand jury passes on the cases. In my opinion the men will be barred from baseball, and in the opinion of eastern fans the majority of them will never don uniforms again."

Stallings and Pearson departed for Los Angeles today where they will winter.

WOMAN HELD FOR PART IN BIG PLATINUM THEFT

NEW YORK, Oct. 22.—Florence Weller who, according to the federal authorities, was recently indicted in Nashville, Tenn., on a charge of conspiracy to dispose of \$19,000 worth of platinum stolen from the army's ordnance bureau, was arrested here today by federal agents.

According to federal agents, thefts of platinum from the war department during the war totalled more than \$500,000. The platinum later was sold to jewelers in this or other cities. Several men were said to have been indicted with Florence Weller.

MINNEAPOLIS FLOUR CUT REFLECTS WHEAT DECLINE

MINNEAPOLIS, Minn., Oct. 22.—Reflecting the break in the wheat market yesterday, flour dropped as much as \$1 a barrel at local mills today. At the largest mill here the price for family patents was reduced to \$11.00 from \$12.00 a barrel, while at another large flour concern a decline of 35 cents was affected, its quotation being \$10.65 a barrel.

N. Y. RESTAURANTS DEFY THREAT OF PROFITEERING

NEW YORK, Oct. 22.—Hotel men here flatly refused to make any reduction in their present food prices at a conference here with Attorney General Palmer.

Mr. Riley then gave warning that investigations would be started immediately by federal agents and wherever it was disclosed that unreasonable prices were being charged, he would submit the evidence to the grand jury and ask for indictments charging profiteering in violation of the Lever act.

Frank A. Boland, counsel for the Hotelmen's association of New York, declared that many hotel restaurants were being operated at an actual loss and others merely managed to break even. He attributed high wages, inefficient labor, cost of food for waiters' meals and the growing reluctance on the part of the New York public to tip, as the causes of this condition.

Mr. Boland admitted that hotel operators invariably realized gross profits of 100 to 200 per cent on the majority of food articles.
