 Authorization to conduct a banking house under the new name has been received by the officers of the bank from the comptroller of the currency. Already the old signs have been taken down and the new boards designating the bank as the National Bank of Commerce have been placed into position.

CITY'S MORALS TO BE PURGED

Civic Organizations Will Be Called to Act by Mayor

To consider means of eradicating undue irregularities alleged to be going on at certain public places in Ogden, Mayor Frank Francis is considering the calling of a meeting of organizations of the city interested in the moral welfare of the community, he announced this morning.
 He said: "Members of the community representing various organizations interested in the welfare and development of the city and who are opposed to things detrimental to Ogden will be asked to co-operate with the mayor and city commission."
 "If a meeting of this sort is called and public sentiment is crystallized against practices now existing, a greater moral influence than the law will be set into motion."
 "The law deals with offenses, while crystallized public opinion will act as a preventive."

Writes History of Irrigation in Utah

The history of the irrigation project in Utah from the days of the pioneers to 1919 is given in a book entitled, "The Development of Institutions Under Irrigation" written by Dr. George Thomas, professor of Economics at the University of Utah.
 In discussing the work of the pioneers Dr. Thomas writes: "The Mormons were the first people to establish an extensive civilization in America with its economic basis resting almost wholly upon irrigation agriculture."
 "Utah became known to the nation and to the world through the efforts of the Utah pioneers a means had been discovered and successfully applied whereby the redemption of large areas of the land of the west was made possible."
 Dr. A. L. Neff, of the history department of the university says of Dr. Thomas' book: "The authoritative contribution by Dr. Thomas illuminates problems fundamental in the economic life of this and other western commonwealths. The development of irrigation institutions and practices in this state has been such that all art sections of the world are looking to Utah's experience for instruction and guidance. Dr. Thomas' book embodies the results of his careful investigation of this characteristic institution of Utah and is a contribution to knowledge that reflects credit and honor both on the author and the builders of the commonwealth."

 Many prominent men and women took part in the tree-planting and the first shovelful of earth was thrown upon the roots by Mrs. Thomas A. Edison in behalf of her husband. Others who attended were Lord and Lady Rathesheadan of the British delegation to the tercentenary celebration of the landing of the Pilgrims, who placed a wreath upon the grave.
 The tree planting launched a movement initiated by the organizations to have trees planted throughout the country upon Mr. Roosevelt's birthday in memory of the former president and other illustrious Americans.
