

# GIRL SCOUTS OF OGDEN GROWING

### Twenty-five Groups Formed in Ogden; Have Influential Backing

With influential men and women of Ogden working earnestly in behalf of the Girl Scout movement in Ogden and with Miss Beulah Brown as executive head, there are now fully organized twenty-five splendid groups of young women and nearly all of this number have passed the tenderfoot examination and are now classed as regular second class scouts.

Friday evening a meeting of captains was held in the basement of Mrs. David Eccles' home, which is the home of the Girl Scouts and Miss Brown reports growing enthusiasm and exceptionally fine work on the part of each captain. Those who have taken charge of troops in the various parts of the city are receiving instructions weekly and as often as required.

#### TO GET UNIFORMS

Very soon the girls will be prepared to send for their uniforms, badges and insignia, and although none of the above are required of the girls, it is desirable that a uniform be worn. Scouts may wear the official girl scout armband until such time as the whole troop is ready to purchase uniforms.

Each week the girls are meeting and the program for the evening or afternoon is fairly divided between recreation and education.

Miss Brown states that all troops are open for new members and that any girl from ten to eighteen years of age, who is willing to subscribe to the promise and laws may qualify to become a scout passing the tenderfoot test. She should either join a troop which is already formed or should get together a group of girls to form a new troop.

Below is a quotation from Mary Roberts Rinehart, well-known novelist and short story writer, who is an enthusiastic believer in the Girl Scout movement:

"Girls are great idealists. No one familiar with the working of the girl's mind can fail to recognize how quickly they respond to ideals. They dream dreams, not of success, but of happiness. They look up rather than down. Some of our girls seem to be taught honesty. They cover their dreams with small deceptions. They seek romance out of sheer boredom, and are driven into hypocrisy. The boy has fewer dreams to conceal, and he is honest with the honesty of fresh air and the great outdoors. When we give our girls occupation, when we get them out of doors, when we give them organized play in the open, there will be fewer mermaid women."

"Give them something to do that interests them. Get them out into the air. Fill in the waiting years with work and play. Give them some roles of life which will appeal alike to their imaginations and to their instinctive desire for something better. Let them look out as well as up."

"Nearest of all the proposed plans to cope with what an increasing number of families are finding to be an acute problem, the adolescent girl, the Girl Scout movement fulfills all these requirements. It is sane, healthy and normal. It teaches civility, energy, vigor and love of country. And it takes the girl in her teens and gives her a live interest in the present instead of the future."

"It should have nation-wide support."

Fred W. Wood was elected as treasurer of the men's department. Directors named included E. R. McKay, Thomas W. Stecker, Hyrum A. Jensen and Peter Johansen.

The members of the bureau expressed favorable opinions regarding the proposed raise in the membership fee of the farm bureau. It is probable that a fee of \$5 will be charged during the next season.


