Ohio State University's football team, champions of the "Big Ten," conference under the direction of Coaches Wilce, Ward and Harley held a snappy workout at Lester Park today shortly after 12 o'clock. The Ohio Staters are en route to Pasadena where they will tangle with the University of California stars New Year's day in the annual East-West battle. They are primed for the contest of their careers, according to Coach Wilce.

The Ohioans arrived in Ogden more than two hours ahead of their previous schedule and upon arrival here were taken immediately to the Ogden high school where they dressed for a work-out.

The practice was held at Lester park with the three coaches directing the work of the team. Punting and the running off of signals featured the workout. 
