

**CHRISTMAS DON'TS
ISSUED IN OGDEN
BY CHIEF GRAVES**

With Christmas trees in thousands of homes, and preparations made for their decoration Christmas eve, G. A. Graves, chief of the Ogdan fire department has issued a list of "don'ts" urging caution in regard to fire.

"Every year in America, many children are burned to death by fire from Christmas candles," Chief Graves said.

Do not decorate your Christmas tree with paper, cotton or any other inflammable material. Use metallic tinsel, asbestos fibre and other non-inflammable decorations only. Set the tree securely so that the children in reaching for their things cannot tip it over.

Do not use cotton or paper snow-powdered mica or asbestos fibre.

Do not use candles for lighting for the safer. If candles are necessary, Electrical illumination is far the safer. If candles are necessary for any reason, do not permit the children to light or relight the candles while parents are not present. They frequently set fire to their clothing instead. If candles are used light the top candles first and extinguish the bottom candles first. Do not allow the candles to burn out.

Do not leave matches within reach of children at holiday time. Candles are meant to be lighted, and if children can get matches they will experiment with them. They imitate their elders.

Do not allow trees to remain inside buildings after the holidays. The tree itself ignites readily when needles have become dry. A large number of fires usually occur in January from this cause.





WASHINGTON, Dec. 21.—The house ways and means committee today voted to recommend for re-drafting the Edmonds bill proposing to defer the date when penalties became effective for failure to pay federal taxes.

Representative Greene, Republican, Iowa, explained that as the bill was reported to the house, it would defer penalties on all uncollected taxes of this and previous years although it was intended to apply only to taxes on this year's income and profits.
