### NEWS IN BRIEF FROM CAPITAL

**WASHINGTON, Jan. 21.**—President Wilson has sent another communication regarding mediation in Armenia to the president of the council of the league of nations, it was said today at the state department. The note has been made public tomorrow and meantime official comment on it is withheld.

Henry Morgenthau, former ambassador to Turkey, who has been named by the president as his representative, is still in the United States awaiting instructions.

**WASHINGTON, Jan. 21.**—Admiral Wilson informed the navy department today by cable that he had assumed command of the United States fleet when the Atlantic and Pacific fleets joined at the Pacific end of the Panama canal. The combined fleet is so known by the navy and the commander of the Atlantic fleet, as senior officer also is commander of the United States fleet.

**WASHINGTON, Jan. 21.**—Enactment of the bill providing government regulation of the meat packing industry would be a step "filled with danger to our institutions and our system of government," Senator Fernald, Republican of Maine, declared today in an address in the senate. "I believe this bill is merely the opening wedge for similar regulation of other private business," the senator said.

Purchased \$255,000 worth of supplies for members of the Utah State Farm Bureau at a vast saving.

Purchased 6,000,000 pounds of corn and 3,000,000 pounds of hay, selling to members at a big saving.

Assisted alfalfa seed growers of Utah in perfecting pool of 4,000,000 pounds of alfalfa seed and 1,000,000 pounds of sweet clover seed.

Secured storage-in-transit rates from southern Utah stations for alfalfa and sweet clover seed shipments, a saving of 6 to 8 cents per hundredweight to Missouri river points.

Secured emergency livestock feed rates to all points south of Salt Lake City from points in Idaho and Nebraska, saving of thousands of dollars in essential feeds.

Secured emergency hay rates to all points south of Salt Lake City from Idaho and Nebraska at tremendous saving. These made it possible to buy hay at remote points where supply was available.

Established a market in New York City for Utah eggs.

Secured financial aid for alfalfa seed growers when money was exceedingly "tight."

Purchased 30,000 pounds of miscellaneous feed at large saving.

Handled 30,000 pounds of feed by parcel post to remote points, saving starving livestock.

Purchased spraying machines, insecticides, washing machines, poultry supplies, grain and seed bags, seed and other supplies.

Furnished special market quotations when requested.

Negotiated farm bureau contracts with sugar and canning companies.

Secured emergency car service for handling all kinds of farm commodities during car shortage.

Secured storage facilities under warehouse receipt plan for large quantities of grain.

Has prepared comprehensive legislative program to be urged at legislature's session, including tax revision.

Systematized the farm business of Utah so that cooperation between farmers having identical interests is possible.

Organized a Home Section with state officers to help direct women's work.

All of this in addition to the excellent work done by the county farm bureaus of Utah, including co-operative buying of purebred livestock, irrigation and drainage district development, insect pest and rodent control, co-operative buying and selling and many other progressive, upbuilding measures.

### SEVERAL BILLS IN DISFAVOR

House Judiciary Committee Reports Out So-called Administration Measures

(Special Dispatch) SALT LAKE, Jan. 21.—The house judiciary committee today reported out several of the administration bills, notably the bill to reduce the number of members on the board of equalization from four to three.

Should the bill be passed by the legislature, it was stated that it was likely no successor would be appointed when the term of Henry Gwilliam of Ogden expires. This would put the board on a basis of three members.

The senate committee on commerce and finance reported out senate bill No. 7 by Jenkins which defines real estate brokers and real estate salesmen, provides for the regulation, supervision and licensing of such brokers and provides for the creation of a real estate department under the direction of the securities commission.

The senate agricultural committee decided to recommend the sending of a memorial to the government asking for further investigation of the Green river irrigation project.

In the judiciary committee of the house the bill to prevent aliens from possessing land in Utah was given consideration but no action was taken.

### MINISTER HELD FOR PART IN BIG MAIL ROBBERY

MOUNT VERNON, Ill., Jan. 21.—Virtually all of the \$185,000 obtained in the theft of 31 packages of registered mail here last Friday was recovered here today by postoffice inspectors in several raids.

Out of four persons arrested on suspicion of complicity in the robbery is the Rev. Guy Kyle, former rector of the Free Methodist church here.

Approximately \$100,000 was found in an egg crate at the home of the Rev. Mr. Kyle, according to the authorities. About \$75,000 was found in one garage and about \$13,000 in another. Both garages are owned by Loren Williamson and the Rev. Mr. Kyle.

Williamson also is being held but postoffice inspectors announced it was on information furnished by him that led to the raids.
