

FIGHT TO BREAK HUGE DRUG 'RING'

More Than 900 Arrested in New York Alone in Three Months

WASHINGTON, March 15.—Success is attending the joint campaign of the federal government and the individual states to stamp out drug traffic.

New York City alone, where the campaign is in charge of Dr. Carl Simon, 300 drug peddlers have been arrested in three months, more than 1,000,000 worth of narcotics have been confiscated and the drug traffic that has made the city its center has been broken up.

Chief of the internal revenue department, says rapid progress also is being made in other cities.

NOVEL METHODS.

All resort to queer methods of detection. One smuggler, a woman, was caught as she stepped off a boat from a port in Frisco. Her skirt was considerably more than the prevailing styles approved. Her white waist was trimmed with deep pockets in which were found 13,000 worth of opium. She's still serving.

After a gun battle with peddlers in a hotel in Oklahoma our men found a complete "dope outfit" in a hole out of the center of the pages of a table. The peddlers now are spending rocks.

An international agreement by which to habit-forming drugs can be brought into a country without the usual tariff has been a big factor in reducing the traffic.

Dr. Simon, new commissioner of the bureau in charge of narcotics, who is leading the New York campaign, says evidence has been obtained that may lead to the arrest of many "highups" in the ring.

YOUNG SLEUTHS.

Here are some of the things Dr. Simon did when he was placed in charge of the campaign:

Organized a special detective force organized at the ages of 23 and 24, men between the ages of 23 and 24.

Provided a wardrobe of disguises permitting his men to mingle with addicts. Established a bureau of identification and a special Bertillon department for filing information on persons arrested in the campaign.

On many occasions Dr. Simon's men have worked away as tramps on vessels to get evidence.

SMUGGLERS SHREWD.

The hunt has been difficult for the officers are cunning. Drugs have been packed in hollow cans, under patches specially sewed on the garments of seaman passengers and in dozens of other novel ways.

"The drug ring," Dr. Simon says, is a fantasy but an actual fact.

It is backed by unlimited funds and resources of all kinds," he says.

It operates in many countries and is organized to have at least 1,000 agents in all the bigger cities. Millions of dollars' worth of drugs are sold annually, at an immense profit, of course, for the ring."


