By ANDRE TARDIEU Former French High Commissioner to America

PARIS, May 13.—Europe needs a clarifier for the horrid problems that are arising simultaneously. When will it arrive?

Today that is the vital question affecting every nation. I wish that I could talk about something besides Genoa, but the conference continues with the attention of the world fixed on the Ligurian coast.

It must be confessed that the problem of Russia's economic reconstruction has been singularly exceeded at Genoa in the various debates and intrigues which have been indulged in.
