JAP TROOPS WILL GIVE UP CHINA PORT

TOKIO, Oct. 28.—(By the Associated Press)—Orders have been sent to the Japanese garrison at Tsing Tao, Shantung, consisting of 200 men, to prepare to evacuate. Under the terms of the treaty with China, the evacuation must be completed early in November.

RUSSIAN CURRENCY OF DIZZY AMOUNT
