PINCHOT MAKES REFORM PLANS

State Budget and General Shakeup Aims of New Governor

PHILADELPHIA, Nov. 9.—Gifford Pinchot, Pennsylvania's Republican governor-elect, planned to slip out of the city for a few days' rest and, he announced, to study his plans for a new state budget and for a state government reorganization scheme to be presented to the legislature.

Late returns intimated that Mr. Pinchot's plurality was increasing as remote regions of the state were heard from. Figures received from 75 of the 821 districts in the state gave him 795,069 votes to 639,577 for John A. McSparran, his Democratic opponent, a lead of 255,492.

LaFollette Holds Majority of 250,000

MILWAUKEE, Wis., Nov. 9.—(By the Associated Press.)—With more than three-fourths of the precincts from Wisconsin reported from Tuesday's election, the available figures indicate that final returns will show U. S. Senator Robert M. LaFollette to have a majority of approximately 250,000 over his opponent, Jesse Jack Hooper, Independent Democrat.
