FOUR HOURS IN THE WEBER RIVER

Man Found Clinging to Bush in Freezing Condition is Rescued

Officers Take Stranded Mexican to Station, Administer Proper Stimulants and Lodge Him.

To fall from the Oregon Short Line railroad bridge at Thirty-second street into the cold water of the Weber river and to remain marooned on a sandbar in the middle of the stream with the muddy water on every side and no relief in sight was the unpleasant experience through which an unknown Mexican went yesterday afternoon.

But after four hours of clinging to the sparse undergrowth, maintaining an upright position on the shifting sand, and almost frozen to death, he was rescued, taken to the police station, tucked snugly in a warm bed and soon dozed off into the sleep which comes only to the exhausted.

The man, who it is said was under the influence of intoxicants, was either walking over the bridge or enjoying an snooze on one of the pillars of the structure when he tumbled over into the water below.
