Congressman McKinley's Forecast to Taft, Pleases the "Regulars" of G. O. P.

BEVERLY, Mass., Aug. 6.—Representative W. B. McKinley of Illinois, chairman of the Republican congressional committee, came to Beverly this afternoon, filled with optimism and gave President Taft and enthusiastic forecast of the coming congressional elections.

BLACK BRUTE'S DEVILISH WORK

Advertises for an Office Assistant to Decoy Girls to Their Death.

ST. LOUIS, Aug. 6.—Miss Bessie Smith, who was decapitated by the Cullender tonight by a bogus advertisement for an office assistant, was rescued from the clutches of the negro janitor of the building as he stood over her with a drawing revolver, by policeman suited to the scene by the advertisement.

A crowd shouting "lynch the brute" gathered and the officers had difficulty in saving the negro from mob violence. He said he was James Bradford, 47 years old. His pockets were filled with answers to the advertisement written by young women, and had photographs of five white girls.

Miss Bessie Smith answered the advertisement Thursday and gave her telephone number. That night the telephone rang and her father J. E. Smith answered the call and became suspicious. An ambulance was arranged for tonight and the scream of a woman led officers to the janitors room where Bradford flourished a revolver and threatened death to them if they interfered. After a struggle he was overpowered and locked up.
