BUILDING FIRETRAPS

Bureau of Education Issues an Appeal For Better Construction in School Houses - Few Have Fireproof Specifications

Washington, May 12.—School houses that are fire traps continue to be erected throughout the country, despite the tragedies of the past, and the United States bureau of education today issued an appeal for better construction of buildings in which the youth is educated.

Out of 238 school buildings noted for one month in 1913, only 22 are reported with fireproof specifications. Cities that have just had destructive school fires appear to be building in the same old way.

The bureau condemns emphatically what it terms "gingerbread school houses that are a constant menace to the lives of schoolchildren."

It expresses astonishment that with the advancement of architecture and the increased knowledge of fireproofing, such buildings should not be tolerated.

It is pointed out that the rapid spread of the school social center movement, which involves extensive use of the school buildings by the general public outside of school hours makes it more important than ever to insist upon adequate fireproof construction in schools.

Most communities appear to be still oblivious of the fire risk in schools, says the bureau's report.

TELLS OF THE ATTEMPTED JAIL BREAK

Salt Lake, May 20.—Caleb A. Inlow, on trial for his life for the last three weeks, smiled in court yesterday for the first time in days, but the jurors did not see the smiles.
