Plans for Bridge over the Potomac. Washington, Sept. 2.—Plans for a \$4,000,000 bridge that would link the capital with Virginia, it was announced today, were being considered by the house commerce committee. The difficulty facing the committee at present is said to be the selection of the site for the Virginia terminus of the structure. It is proposed to make the bridge the structure that will stand for centuries and will admit of the passage of such shipping as uses the upper Potomac river. Under the tentative plans, the bridge would have eighty feet of clearance from the river's surface, thus doing away with the necessity of draws. The details are being worked out by a sub-committee and a report is expected in the immediate future.
