GOULD TO BUY A HYDRO-AEROPLANE. New York, Sept. 9.—It was reported here today that Edwin Gould, brother of George J. Gould, attracted by the tests of Harold F. McCormick of Chicago, as a commuter by hydro-aeroplanes, had purchased two of these machines for his own use. Mr. Gould recently spent some time studying the mechanism of Mr. McCormick's flying boat at Lake Forest, near Chicago, and it is said that he decided to place orders for two elaborate machines, one built for speed only and the other, to be the largest ever built, to accommodate six persons. Although Mr. Gould could launch his hydro-aeroplanes in the Hudson near his home in Ardsley, it is said, that he does not contemplate making his flights on the Hudson, but along the coast between New London and New York. He hopes, it is said, to go all the way from New London to Palm Beach some time next month.
