THE WORLD'S MARKET NEWS. WALL STREET. New York, Sept. 25.—Reluctance to increase commitments on the long side of the market, owing to uncertainties of the present situation in business and finance, both at home and abroad, rendered abortive efforts to gather a following for an upward movement by marking up prices briskly at the outset today.

Advances were forced in some cases purely as a result of a strong technical position, but the general movement did not impress the rank and file of traders, who sold freely at the top. Unconfirmed reports of a pending government suit were circulated to account for the drop in Can, which was under a peculiar heavy pressure. People's Gas fell back nearly four points, and rumor had it that plans for the merger of the corporation with

another large lighting company had been abandoned. Numerous advances of a point or more were converted into fractional losses. Bonds were easy.

Chicago Market. Chicago, Sept. 25.—Supply of pigs was moderate and prices advanced today. Choice steers and yearlings sold well, but other cattle were slow. Liberal receipts eased sheep prices.

Big receipts in the spring crop region carried wheat prices today down grade. The totals of arrivals was much in excess of both last week and last year. The opening was unchanged to 3-8c lower and a further decline followed.

Clear weather and liberal receipts weakened corn. Longs were the principal sellers. Prices started unchanged to 1-4c off and suffered an additional sag.

First transactions in provisions were from unchanged to 5 cents advance and there was a continued hardening of the market, aided by strength at the yards.

Heavy rains in Kansas and Nebraska relieving anxiety about wheat seeding acted in favor of the bears. The close was steady but 3-8 to 1-2@5-8c net lower.
