THE PULP OF THE KYUO

By means of an improved process of manufacture, a German company has succeeded in finding a more extended use of a fruit that grows wild in tropical Africa. From the dried pulp of the Kuyo, a fruit nearly as big as a fig, it has manufactured a fabric which serves as an excellent padding for coverlets, furs and cushions, and which is fast becoming a rival to sea-grass and horse-hair. It is white, elastic and unabsorbent to damp. Owing to the fact that it remains for a long time impervious to water, the new material is eminently suitable for the manufacture of life-belts and for imparting buoyancy to life-boats as it contains the same properties as cork, and is much cheaper. The German Colonial Administration is so organizing the undertaking, that gangs of natives will continually be at work gathering this fruit and packing it carefully for transmission.-Continental Correspondence.
