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Washington, Dec. 4.—Exports of American zinc during the last three months broke all previous records, totaling 65,594, 574 pounds and valued at \$4,443,331, the bulk of which went to Europe. These figures, which were announced by the department of commerce today compare with 1,346,877 pounds, valued at \$80,756 in the like period of 1913.

The exports of zinc in the three months represented about 10 per cent of the annual domestic output which in 1912 totaled 647,314,000 pounds. Shipments of zinc in September alone amounting to 28,990,144 pounds exceeded those in 1917, the former high record year when they were 33,869,987 pounds.

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GERMAN LINER DRIVEN ASHORE

Prinz Friedrich Wilhelm Hard and Fast on Sand Bank at Bergen.

Bergen, Norway, Dec. 4.—Via London, 2:20 p. m.—The North German Lloyds liner Prinz Friedrich Wilhelm, which has been lying in this port for some time drifted ashore in a gale. She is now fast on a sand bank.

The Prinz Friedrich Wilhelm, a vessel of 3840 tons was engaged before the war in the regular service of the North German Lloyd line, between Bremen and New York. After the outbreak of hostilities she was unable to make a German port and has been at Bergen and the neighboring port of Odde.
