

THEATERS

AT THE ORPHEUM. The holiday program of Pantages vanderhille drew large crowds to the Orpheum theatre yesterday afternoon and evening. A portion of it kept them keenly interested and amused. Mysticism and trickery loom large on the bill, while dextrous juggling and music gave variety.

The principal attraction is an act presented by George Lovetto, entitled "Concentration." Lovetto is assisted by Madame Zenda and Mercedes Crane and their work creates much wonderment. The act is a demonstration of what is known on the stage as the psychic art or mental telepathy and reveals in Lovetto a man possessed of a remarkable memory which is accepted as mental suggestion. Madame Zenda displays great powers of concentration and Mercedes Crane is a fine pianist, in addition to possessing what is called psychic powers.

In their performance, Lovetto receives written or spoken questions and requests for musical numbers from the audience and the more numerous the questions and requests, the more interesting the act is made. The questions are put to Madame Zenda by Lovetto, through a mental telepathy process and she answers them without hesitation and with an almost uncanny correctness. In the same way, Lovetto conveys the melodies of the musical numbers requested and Miss Crane plays them. The act is deeply interesting and was well received.

The Five Normans, novelty club jugglers, come next to "Concentration" in the scoring of favor. In its entirety their act is not new, but they have several well practiced ensemble "feats" that are out of the ordinary. Their work was enthusiastically received. Fred Lewis, a comedian and all around entertainer, and Martha Chapin, a burlesquer, appear under the title of "Nifty Nuts" and live up to it. Among other—and numerous—funny things, they burlesque the headline act in a manner that creates almost continuous laughter.

With a few tricks of magic and a swiftly running line of comedy patter, E. J. Moore keeps the audience laughing for nearly fifteen minutes. He has a tendency, however, to overdo the "foolishness" which should be curbed. The Allstar duo, a couple of young ladies with good voices, receive applause for some solos and duet numbers. By keeping in touch with the programs of entertainers ahead of them on the circuit, however, their "turn" could be improved.

Lee Zimmerman is a whistler "par excellence." He opens the vaudeville program with some minor whistling solos and imitations and then performs the rather remarkable feat of whistling the "Foot and Peasant" overture, with full orchestra accompaniment. He was enthusiastically applauded.

AT THE ALHAMBRA.

The patrons of the Alhambra theatre yesterday afternoon and evening were treated to as fine a vaudeville entertainment as could well be wished for, the "Orpheum" stamp of merit being indelibly marked on each of the eight acts and the "movie" traveltogue. There is good variety, too, in the program, making it possible for the audience to express a full measure of approval for the work of each individual or set of entertainers.

Garcinetti Brothers, foreign athletes and jugglers, follow the travelogue and start the vaudeville program off well with some feats that shine with newness. Their specialty, aside from some skillful somersaulting, is hat throwing and this they do with amazing accuracy. Taking six tall narrow brimmed Mexican hats, they throw them from different distances and angles on to each other's head. To cap the climax one member of the duo makes his way to the balcony in the auditorium and from a box "rings" his companion's head seven times with as many hats, while he stands behind the footlights.

Mignonne Kokin, a comedienne and dancer, to which talents a pleasing personality is added, sings a song or two and then gives some clever imitations of noted dancers from Fred Stone and George M. Cohan to Anna Pavlova. She made a big hit with yesterday's audiences and received several encore calls.

The next act, presented by Miss Bon Fon Que and Harry Law, a Chinese couple, was the novelty of the evening and made the biggest hit. The orientals are well educated in American ways of action and speech and they have worked up a singing and dancing act of much merit. Their voices are of pleasing quality and the opening part of the act is given over to the singing of some specially written solos and duets in English. These are encased and the curtain is then lifted on a rich stage setting in which the couple give their own interpretation of modern dances, including the fox trot, one step, gavotte and the other "cake walk."

The figures in such are new and their "gavotte" is one of the prettiest dances that has yet been seen in the city. Miss Bon Fon Que and her companion are graceful dancers and add to the charm of their work by appearing in rich native costumes.

Miss Laura Larson of Salt Lake—a sister of Director Larson of the Alhambra orchestra—is next given a place on the program and fills it well. She sings several soprano solos with fine effect, being the possessor of a voice of much promise and unusually pleasing stage presence. Her singing, however, could be improved by a clearer enunciation of words.

"The Bank's Half Million," a Paul Armstrong sketch, proves rarely interesting.

Elsie Fay, an unusually gifted entertainer, and her assistants, Joe Miller and John Hogan, dancers and singers, win enthusiastic applause in a program before the curtain. An almost perfect enunciation of words is a big factor in the success of Miss Fay's songs, which are new and give unalloyed delight. She also dances with the two men and the work of the trio is pleasing from start to finish. Ti Ling Sing, a Chinese violinist, is another novelty. It is not too much to say that no other violinist who has been heard locally in vaudeville, has yet approached in quality. The several selections that he played were keenly enjoyed.

"A Day at the Races," presented by Galletti's Baboons, closes the program and sends the patrons from the theatre in a merry mood. The baboons are well trained and the act is arranged to please people of all ages.


