G. A. R. RESOLUTIONS ENDORSED ACTION OF GOV. SPRY

Dix-Logan Post No. 3 G. A. R. has adopted resolutions commending the course of Governor Spry in "his recent unpleasant duties." The resolutions follow:

"Resolved, that Dix-Logan Post No. 3, G. A. R., Department of Utah desires to convey to Governor William Spry, its approval of his course and actions in observing and performing his recent unpleasant duties, in the enforcement of the law of the land.

"We commend him for his courage in not being swayed from his purpose of fulfilling his pledged and sworn obligations and duties as governor, by the cowardly, secret threats of anarchists and assassins.

"We pledge him our sympathy and hearty support in his endeavors to rid our state of the dangerous and disgraceful element, that has lately been attempting to intimidate him and the decent, respectable, law-abiding people of our state."

DR. E. L. HOUSE WILL REMAIN ANOTHER WEEK IN OGDEN

Last night a large audience listened to the Rev. Edwin L. House, D. D., give his address in the First Methodist Episcopal church on "Spiritual vs. Mental Healing." Dr. House believes that it is possible for one to be so in tune with the infinite spirit of God that physical healing can be brought about through spiritual forces as a direct work of grace from Christ as the Saviour. He makes a distinction between mental and spiritual healing of the day, challenges the church to demonstrate the superiority of spiritual healing. He declares, however, that the salvation of the body is not nearly so important as the salvation of the soul, and that one should not lose hold of Christ as an atoning Savior in the search for physical benefits.

Arrangements have been made to have Dr. House remain another week before he begins his series of meetings in Salt Lake. His meetings will be held in the First Methodist church. A private class is to be formed for the week afternoons, but Sunday afternoons, and the evening meetings will be free. The following subjects will be treated:

FREIGHT BULLETIN OF ELECTRIC ROAD

W. B. Mowbray, traffic manager of the Ogden, Logan and Idaho Railway company, has issued the following bulletin in freight rates and schedules: "All shippers to Ogden, North Ogden, Plain City, Farr West, Huntsville and Eden.

"Effective Friday, November 26, 1915, this company will inaugurate a local freight service between Ogden and Huntsville and Eden, North Ogden, Plain City and intermediate points.

"Freight which is to go to Huntsville, Eden, Plain City, Farr West, and North Ogden, will have to be prepaid on account of no agents at these points. Less than car load freight will be received for all destinations at these points with charges collect. "Trains will run as follows: "Leaves Ogden for Huntsville, 9 a. m., Monday, Wednesday and Friday of each week. "Leaves Huntsville at 10 a. m. on these days. "Leaves Ogden for Plain City and North Ogden, 9 a. m., Tuesday, Thursday and Saturday of each week. "Leaves Plain City at 8 a. m. and leaves North Ogden at 10:30 a. m. "Freight will be received by our conductors at Plain City at the usual stopping place of the passenger car; at North Ogden in front of Williams' store; Eden at the switch; Huntsville at Peterson Bros. store."

AUTOIST BOUND OVER.

Pocatello, Ida., Nov. 26.—R. M. Barsden, a prominent contractor of this city, was taken before Justice of the Peace Van Ruth today on a charge of involuntary manslaughter, on a complaint signed by Sheriff W. W. Cooper. The preliminary hearing was waived and the accused was bound over to the district court and released on a \$2000 bond.

The charge grew out of an automobile accident which occurred near McCammon on October 30 last, in which Mrs. Grace Gray, one of the occupants of the automobile which Barsden was driving, was killed. A coroner's inquest was held over the

body of the dead woman and a verdict was rendered acquitting Barsden of any responsibility. The matter was then put up to County Attorney Smith, but he has been slow to take action. The filing of a complaint signed by the sheriff finally brought the matter to a focus. Attorneys B. A. Cummings and Colonel H. V. Ferguson will conduct the case for the defense.
