Speaker Gillett Offends Mexicans; Embassy Protests

WASHINGTON, June 3.—Diplomatic protest has been made by the Mexican embassy against the speech delivered by Speaker Gillett yesterday at the Pan-American congress in which he declared Mexico the greatest impediment to the establishment of satisfactory trade relations between the American republics. The protest declares Speaker Gillett's utterances false so far as they related to the state of Mexican commerce which it is asserted has shown remarkable development during the last year or two. State department officials are disturbed by the incident and are expected to deny responsibility and probably express regret.
