
Mays of Utah Introduces Bill For Branch Offices

WASHINGTON, June 24—Establishment of a branch of the interior department in some western state with several of the department's bureaus removed there from Washington was proposed in a bill introduced today by Representative Mays, Democrat of Utah. His measure would appropriate \$1,000,000 for the branch headquarters, which would house the general land office, the geological survey, the bureau of mines, the reclamation service, the Indian bureau and the national park and forest services.
