

MAY POSTPONE STRIKE 90 DAYS

Men to Await Effect of Government Action on Cost of Living.

WASHINGTON, Aug. 28.—Industrial peace in the United States, according to the legislative council of the railroad shop crafts, depends on the results the government can show in the next ninety days in its campaign to reduce the cost of living.

That time limit was tacitly set today by the legislative council in suggesting to union locals throughout the country that President Wilson's compromise offer in response to their demand for higher wages should be accepted pending the outcome of the effort to restore a normal price level.

If the cost of living does not come down, the 500,000 members of the shop crafts would reserve the right to strike for money; and with them probably would be associated the remainder of the 2,500,000 railroad employees, all of whom have been considering the same problem.

The letter of the executive council served to compose somewhat the uneasiness felt in official circles over the immediate labor situation and to focus attention on the legal measures being directed by Attorney General Palmer and his assistant, Judge Ames, to take the inflation out of prices, to punish hoarders and profiteers.

"In our opinion," the letter said, "the next ninety days will bring the entire situation to a head and if a strike is to take place every class of railroad employees should be willing to join in the movement, share their full measure of responsibility and not leave the issue to be decided by the 22 per cent of the railroad employees represented by the federated trades."

Apprehension was evident, however, both in the letter and in the conversation of the international officers, that the men might not be willing to accept the suggestion that the question of a strike be left in the hands of the executive council and a suspension of work to be ordered only "after a reasonable time" had made it clear that such a step was necessary to afford relief. The letter said the proposal was certain to draw criticisms from individuals "who have not as yet indicated a desire to leave to reason" and that it was conceivable some men would want to rush into a strike now. Officers of the unions declined to hazard a guess whether or not a strike would be called, but hoped that the more moderate element would dominate the deliberations.

Attorney General Palmer had said that a few convictions for flagrant cases of profiteering and hoarding would end that trouble within sixty days. In order to obtain critical convictions for such persons, whom the administration believes to be guilty of bringing the country into more serious danger even than the war with Germany, amendment to the food control law now pending in congress is necessary. The legislation to impose \$5000 fine or two years imprisonment or both for violations of the law has been reported out in both house and senate, but neither has acted on it.

NEGRO CHURCHES AND A LODGE BURNED DOWN

EASTMAN, Ga., Aug. 28.—The charred body of Eli Cooper, a negro, was found today in the ashes of a negro church, which was burned by incendiaries early this morning. Three other negro churches and a negro lodge in this section were burned Tuesday night. The acts of violence followed reports that the negroes planned to "rise up and wipe out the white people," and that Cooper remarked the negroes had been "run over for fifty years, but this will all change in thirty days."

The only explanations for the burning of the churches and lodge rooms was that these were said to have been the scenes of mass meetings recently during which the uprising of negroes were said to have been distributed at these meetings.

Cooper was taken from his home Wednesday night, according to his wife, by a crowd of about twenty white men. The negro was taken several miles by the mob and it is presumed that he was shot by the crowd and his body thrown into the burning church.

President Should Call Conference in Washington

WASHINGTON, Aug. 28.—President Wilson should call a conference of representatives of capital, labor, industrial managers and the public to meet in Washington in the near future to discuss perplexing economic problems confronting the nation, Secretary of the Interior Lane declared in a statement today.

Heretofore, only capital and labor have been considered in discussions of vital economic questions, he asserted, but the time has come when the public must be given a voice as well as the business managers and executives who are "the brains of modern industrial organizations."

Los Banos, Cal., Almost Wiped Out By a Big Blaze

MERCED, Calif., Aug. 28.—Fire originating in a former saloon wiped out two square blocks in the heart of the business section of Los Banos, thirty-five miles from here last night, causing between \$750,000 and \$1,000,000 in losses and destroying the habitations of at least 20 people.

When the flames were checked appraisers said forty-eight buildings and places of business had been wiped out the list including the Portuguese-American and First National banks, the Bank of Los Banos, the brick post-office, the opera house, two big garages and numerous hotels and lodging houses.

For hours after the fire Los Banos was cut off from all wire communication with the outside. A telephone service was restored late today.

The cause of the fire was unknown.

FRENCH PRAISED BY GEN. PERSHING

PARIS, Aug. 28.—"When one has known the generous French people, when one has seen them in trial and in time of rejoicing, one cherishes such respect and friendship for them that one parts from them with real sorrow," said General J. J. Pershing to a representative of the Journal today.

"I regret exceedingly that I shall be unable to be present at the unveiling of the monument September 6, at Pointe de LaGrave, raised to commemorate the arrival of the first American troops in France. Unfortunately my departure cannot be postponed, the United States senate having expressed a wish to receive me as soon as possible."

General Pershing is expected to sail for home from Brest, September 1. The monument at Pointe de LaGrave, which is situated at the mouth of the Gironde river northwest of Bordeaux is near the spot from which LaFayette sailed for the United States. The unveiling of the monument will take place on the anniversary of the birth of LaFayette.

Reception for Pershing. WASHINGTON, Aug. 28.—General Pershing will undoubtedly be given an official welcome home at a joint session of congress, leaders said tonight. A resolution providing that the speaker of the house appoint a committee to meet with a similar committee from the senate to arrange the welcoming session, was adopted by the house today by unanimous vote. The resolution will be sent to the senate tomorrow and its prompt adoption is predicted.

So far as leaders tonight knew the senate has made no direct request that General Pershing be received as soon as possible as stated in an interview given the Paris Journal by the American commander. It was thought that General Pershing referred to the desire of the senate military affairs committee to hear his view as soon as possible in the framing of pending legislation outlining the nation's permanent military policy. General March, chief of staff, Secretary Baker and other military leaders who served both at home and overseas already have been heard and committee members are known to desire the appearance of General Pershing at an early date.
