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EXTENSION OF CABLES URGED BY GEN. SQUIER

WASHINGTON, Nov. 14.—Extension of the cables as an aid to the development of the nation's foreign commerce was urged before the senate commerce committee today by Major General Squier, chief signal officer of the American army. The committee is considering a bill providing for a new cable line across the Pacific.

SCOWCROFTS TO HAVE MUCH ENLARGED PLANT

A modern plant to be used in the manufacture of overalls, shirts, pants and undergarments is being constructed in Ogden. The firm of John Scowcroft and Sons is remodeling its former warehouse, on the west side of Wall avenue and Twenty-fourth street, with the view of making this plant one of the most modern industrial plants of the west.

Athletic Club Is To Be Organized

Ogden will be placed on the map in the intermountain country as an athletic center in the near future, if plans of a number of local stars are carried out. In parts of Utah the athlete, after completing his schooling, is compelled to forsake sport for the simple reason that the communities lack athletic clubs.

The athlete should be well trained, he should have the ginger, the speed, endurance for emergency and should be able to go in the pink of condition at a few weeks' notice. This is the statement made by a local star today. Ogden has some wonderful athletes. In the grid game she has produced some wonders and a majority of the stars have made national and western reputations. Such men as Warner, Douglas, Glasmann, Hastings, Moran, and numerous others compare with other stars in other parts of the country.

More than fifty men have signified their willingness to foster a club in Ogden and the youths who were stars yesterday will have a chance to come back and show their class under colors of the city of Ogden.

While no definite action has been taken, the club will probably be known as the Ogden Athletic club. Leonard Ruckham, old time gridiron star, is one of the backers of the movement. Stone, the old-time Ogden star and other players are also expected to enlist in the fight for athletics.

American Business Men Must Mend Ways in Future

SAN FRANCISCO, Nov. 14.—American business houses must mend their ways if they are to compete with European manufacturers in the Latin American trade, according to R. H. Miller, proprietor of a large brass foundry in Torreon, Mexico, who will be a delegate to the national foreign trade council which will convene here next May.

There are four practices American houses perform, or fail to perform, which are discrediting them in the eyes of the Latin-American buyers, according to Mr. Miller. The first and most pernicious practice, he says, in a letter to the chamber of commerce here, is failure to observe shipping instructions. He points out that every country has different customs requirements, methods of transportation, etc., and that few American houses are conversant with these. To make the matter worse, he emphasizes when given detailed instructions for shipment, the American houses ignore them.

Substitution of articles ordered and failure to pack properly are other points the Americans neglect, he says. "Another kick against shipments from the states is the packing," says Mr. Miller. "Most houses pack for export the same as for domestic shipment. They do not take into consideration the longer haul, the number of transfers or the fact that the packages are to be opened at the border for customs inspection. More goods from the United States are lost or broken because of poor packing than from any other country in the world."

Levels Are Being Run by Engineers

The running of levels from the bluffs surrounding Huntsville for the purpose of determining the fall of the land and the best points of vantage for the making of water allotments, occupied the time today of government engineers, working in that vicinity in the interest of the proposed Weber County Irrigation district. Soil borings also took a part of the time today, the borings being made to determine the extent and the composition in the water tables in that vicinity. This factor will be of considerable importance in the making of water allotments, it is stated, inasmuch as the allotments will be based upon the need of the various types of soil for irrigation water.

Sprint Star Is On a Visit to Friends in Ogden

Franklin Crane, well known athlete of Chicago, a member of the Illinois Athletic club of that city and rated as one of the fastest sprint stars that ever represented the Illinois club in action, is in Ogden visiting friends.

Laws Legitimizing Children Urged by Women's Council

ST. LOUIS, Mo., Nov. 14.—Laws legitimizing children born out of wedlock were urged before the National Women's Council in the resolutions presented today by Mrs. Ellen Spencer Mussey, chairman of the Department of legal status of women and children. The resolution which was unanimously adopted, included the rights of the child to the father's name and to inherit property of both parents.

Other resolutions presented by Mrs. Mussey advocated the establishment of minimum wage boards in all states, urged laws giving joint and equal guardianship of parents over minor children and for raising the age necessary for making a contract and appeal to congress to pass laws allowing women marrying aliens to retain their citizenship.

Mrs. Mussey said that approximately 20,000 alien brides of American soldiers are now in this country. She proposed that all alien women should be required to elect whether they would become naturalized or desired to retain their native citizenship.

The report of Dr. Elizabeth Thelberg, chairman of the public health department, urged compulsory notification of venereal diseases to health authorities. She advocated the laboratory method of examination.

Mrs. Carrie Chapman Catt and Miss Lucy E. Anthony were elected governors of the international council which will be held in Norway in September, 1920. This council meets every five years.
